How did you discover Montessori Center School?

When Zahra was 4 years old, we were living in a school district where we felt the school would not be a good fit for our family. We wanted to find a school that offered preschool through elementary grades and provided an approach to learning outside of what is found in traditional school settings. I had two friends whose children were attending MCS, and they loved it. That led us to find out more about the Montessori philosophy and MCS.

What drew you to MCS?

Before the tour we were impressed with the Montessori philosophy and approach to learning that "follows the child" by encouraging children to follow their natural curiosity while supporting different learning styles. The tour of MCS definitely "sealed the deal." From the moment we stepped onto campus, we felt a sense of belonging. The people were warm and friendly, and the campus was beautifully serene. The classrooms were amazing! Seeing very young children working quietly with so much focus and order around them made a big impression on us that led us to believe our daughter would greatly benefit at MCS. The first time we met Mikki Jee (in Red Door) she was able to engage our daughter in an activity that interested her immediately. It was so impressive and confirmed that we were making the right choice.

What does your child enjoy most about the Montessori approach to learning?

Zahra is now 11 years old and has been at MCS since she was 4. She also had the experience of attending another school very briefly. She tells us she is very appreciative of the MCS philosophy that puts so much faith in the children being able to plan the course of their work day and meet the goals expected of them from their teachers. She loves the flexibility of the classroom, the rich environment of materials and resources and the supportive, caring teachers available to her every day.

What stands out about the faculty?

The teachers that have been with us on our MCS journey have been outstanding in helping our daughter develop as a whole person. They truly care about her well-being. Every teacher has shown commitment to understanding Zahra as an individual and not just another face in the classroom. We appreciate that all the teachers are devoted to working with her to help her academically and socially. They have been tireless in their commitment to open and frequent communication with us, sharing highlights in the classroom as well as special moments of personal development (and sharing moments when behavior needed to change). We know all teachers are extremely busy, but it felt like our teachers always had time to connect with us, to share highlights, tell us about special and fun moments and answer any questions we had.

What is your favorite activity or event that takes place during the year?

We love the Harvest Picnic. It is the one day where all MCS families (even those no longer at the school) can come together for a very relaxing time. Even the set up and clean up times have been fun and created a bonding experience with other parents.

What motivates you to be involved at the school?

We know how hard the teachers and staff work to make the school experience rewarding for all the students and families. It's a way to give back on a small level and to also participate with our child in the MCS experience. We love meeting and getting to know other parents. We treasure the friendships that we have made at MCS.

What one or two aspects of learning at MCS do you hope your child will carry on through her entire life?

We feel that MCS has given Zahra the confidence that comes from an incredible foundation of learning. She has the tools she needs to seek and use knowledge that will help her succeed academically, as an individual and as a member of the community. She has learned to be confident in asking questions and finding answers for herself, instead of just following what someone tells her to do.

We hope that her MCS experience will have shaped a profound respect and appreciation for knowledge and learning. The MCS community is very accepting, non-judgmental and supportive, and we hope she can carry those lessons with her for life.

What are some of your favorite memories at MCS?

We loved the Mother's Day Brunch in Green Door. Irene encouraged Zahra and Adiya to sing a song together (something we never imagined Zahra would want to do). It was what we called "The Green Door Song" – *Bubbly* by Colbie Caillat. It was the most beautiful performance, so full of heart and love and confidence. We will treasure that always.

Serving tea in Red Door for Grandfriends' Day—Mikki taught the class how to make tea from tea leaves growing in the Red Door garden. It was inspiring to watch the children taking the time to make something lovely and special for someone else to enjoy. They had confidence in handling very delicate things like a porcelain tea pot and cup, pouring hot water (with a little help). It was a perfect example of the way MCS instills the "I can do it!" attitude in young children.

In Brown Door, we watched Zahra play her violin for the Talent Show. Even though she was very nervous about performing in front of her classmates, she performed so beautifully. We really appreciate the support Cyd gave her to go on stage despite her fears. Cyd is so inspiring in the way she encourages students to step out of their comfort zone and expand their boundaries.

From the President of the Board of Trustees

Dear Montessori Families,

It has been an honor to have just completed my first year of serving as the President of the Board of Trustees. When my children first started at Montessori seven years ago, I would have laughed if someone were to tell me that I'd be writing this letter to you today. When we first came to Montessori we heard about how each family is expected to serve the greater community in some manner. I expected that I'd come in to read to the classes sometimes or work a bake sale every now and then. However, as I started to watch as my son began to blossom in his classes, I realized I might want to do a little bit more than that. Did we do everything we could to prepare them for this new adventure? As I ask myself this question at the beginning of each year, I am quickly answered by the love and support that every teacher and staff member at MCS shows our children. Yes, we made the right choice. This is where they belong.

I'm looking forward to my second year as Board President. We have a strong and committed Board of Trustees who are dedicated to the success of the school. We have fourteen Board members this year serving as trustees and members of the different committees dedicated to serving the needs of the school. Some of you may have interest in serving on a committee or on the Board. We welcome any and all interest, and I or any Board member would be happy to meet and discuss opportunities with you. The future of the school depends on dedicated individuals who will help guide the long-term strategic planning for MCS.

As we enter the new school year, I'm excited by what's to come and I look forward to seeing all of you around the campus. But I have to admit I'm most excited to see the students return to the classrooms and to once again see the wonder in them as they have that learning experience that only comes from a Montessori education.






