## MCS Family Interview The Jacobsen Family



### How did you discover Montessori Center School?

Our family has been fortunate to have several good friends who recommended MCS to us. We've admired these families over the past 20 years and enjoyed watching the paths they were taking with their children. As we've watched these children grow and mature, we've been impressed with the kind, creative, intelligent and well-balanced young adults they have become. This encouraged us to have a strong look at Montessori for our children.

### What drew you to MCS?

During our tour, I remember walking into Margaret McCleery-Cota's pre-primary classroom and feeling impressed as I observed her interact with over 20 toddlers doing their "work" in harmony. Another fond memory during our tour was strolling into a peaceful Art Room during the pre-primary session and observing toddlers carefully creating their masterpieces with classical music in the background. These observations coupled with the welcoming staff, organized classrooms, amazing materials and fun methods of teaching ultimately drew us in.

## What do your children enjoy most about the Montessori approach to learning?

We believe our children enjoy the fun, creative and flexible approach to learning the most. The fact that they're exposed to a variety of enriching activities and they get to experience hands-on demonstrations is invaluable. We truly value the positive modeling and consistent practice of treating children with respect and courtesy.

### What stands out about the faculty at MCS?

The teachers are amazing and make MCS an extraordinary place. Their patience and commitment to our children are unsurpassed. Although all of the classrooms have the same materials, the teachers are each unique and wonderful in their own way. We've been so fortunate to have outstanding teachers who have made our boys feel special and supported. There's a genuine kindness from the staff and interest in each individual child. We've appreciated the communication and relationship with our teachers as well as connections we've made with the staff at MCS.

## What motivates you to be involved at the school?

Our boys second home is MCS so we take a lot of pride and dedication in our school. We believe the success of our children doesn't stop weekdays at 3 p.m. There's an inherent partnership between the school and the parents, and we understand that the success of our children requires community support. 




