

Providing Relief in Mexico

On Tuesday, September 19 a powerful earthquake jolted central Mexico. The earthquake buckled buildings, cracked foundations and brought rubble down all around Mexico City. The U.S. Geological Survey has said the quake had a magnitude of 7.1 and was centered near Puebla. Immediately following the quake **HOPE worldwide Mexico I.A.P.** jumped into action to serve those in need. For many years local medical professionals have served at the HOPEww clinic in Mexico City providing basic medical and dental care. Following the quake, the clinic opened and medical care was provided to many families in need. \$5,000 from concerned donors helped to restock supplies and support the local volunteer effort.

Dominica

HOPE worldwide volunteers from Trinidad and Tobago and Grenada leapt into action after Hurricane Maria made landfall in Dominica. Within days, with financial assistance from the Hww Global Disaster Response fund, volunteers mobilized two shipments of goods and two volunteer teams to help their neighbors to the north.



Houston

After Harvey made landfall, *HOPE worldwide* established a disaster coordinator and quickly organized 6 teams of volunteers from Houston, Dallas, San Antonio, Austin, Baton Rouge & others across the US. These teams cleared 35 homes of debris, wet carpet, and dry-wall, preparing them for repairs.

HURRICANE MATTHEW

- \$200,000 raised from U.S. Churches and Individuals
- \$10,000 in relief sent within a few days of landfall in Haiti
- 11 homes rebuilt within the first few months
- School roof repair in Les Cayes
- 14 additional homes to be rebuilt/repared in Fall 2017

HURRICANE HARVEY

- \$300,000 raised from U.S. Churches & online gifts
- 35 homes cleared of debris
- 17 owned by members of The Greater Houston Church
- 6 Disaster Corps teams deployed in first 5 weeks
- Local Disaster Coordinator hired to meet ongoing needs

HURRICANE IRMA AND MARIA

- \$80,000 raised & counting...
- \$5,000 in relief sent within days of landfall in Puerto Rico
- \$10,000+ in supplies sent on 16 palettes by air and by ship
- 2 shipments sent by boat from Trinidad to Dominica
- Disaster Corps team sent to Key West FL to clear debris
