Wheel of Fortune for PowerPoint version 4.0 is now available, introducing a redefined Wheel experience with an all-new paradigm that changes how you and your contestants enjoy the game. The update has been months in the making, featuring significant milestones and extensive development. For those who tested the beta versions, thank you, and for new users, welcome to this major improvement. A key feature is Set Up Puzzles, allowing you to input puzzles beforehand using the in-game editor, then load them onto the puzzle board when ready. Editing puzzles is easy, with features like alignment arrows, erasers, and a trashcan to erase rows or delete entire puzzles. The Calculator tab is gone, but its function has been replaced by the Load Puzzle tab, which loads puzzles exactly as set without letters for contestants to fill in. The new top-left letter selector replaces the Letters Used box, allowing contestants to guess letters directly on the puzzle board, eliminating the need for solution cards. Overall, this update offers a more efficient and enjoyable experience for hosts and contestants alike, with features like highlighted blue tiles when guessing a letter and a simplified solution process. You'll see the tab reappear so you can load another puzzle. However, there's more to Set Up Puzzles than just the editor itself. Clicking the gear icon gives you access to a settings panel where you can adjust vowel prices, house minimums, and how the puzzle board operates. You can also view all puzzles or delete them altogether. The user interface has been improved with changes like the default Studio backdrop now having a different shade of purple, player scores being white, and categories being capital-enforced. Design adjustments have been made to improve usability. The wheel has also seen some work, with it now landing on a randomly generated space and the option to remove wild card and mystery wedges. The bonus round is now supported, allowing contestants to reveal letters in the puzzle. Additionally, PowerPoint for Mac support has been added, with differences including input boxes for editing text and limited animation triggers. A new video guide has also been developed. During development, I struggled with the long cycle, which took a toll on me. However, beta testers helped ease my concerns. Their positive feedback and smiles while playing, even with bugs, showed me that a game's value lies in its fun, not just its polish. I'm exhausted but grateful for their support. The latest version, 4.0, addresses major issues and introduces new features like puzzle solution autofill and improved graphics. It's now compatible with Macs and has a refined setup process. To use it, you'll need PowerPoint 2201 with macros enabled. This template allows for up to 20 puzzles across four types, semi-automated setup, and a scoreboard that adjusts scores automatically. It also includes sound effects, graphics, and Easter eggs. The instructions are clear, and images can be adjusted to display player names. The template is designed for three players or groups. Gameplay features include a scoreboard section, bonus round wheel, and regular rounds with automatic tile reveal. Template usage guidelines state that designs can be used for personal and educational purposes only, while commercial use is prohibited. A disclaimer notes that the Wheel of Fortune template is fan-made and not affiliated with the original game's production company.
