For proper use, children must meet size and age requirements found on the following pages. Consult with your child's physician before transitioning between modes. The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends keeping children rear-facing as long as possible until reaching maximum height or weight for their Car Seat. Some states' laws require rear-facing until age 2. Page 88: Preterm or Low Birth Weight Infant Guidelines Before using this Child Restraint with preterm or low birth weight infants, ensure the child requirements are met and follow guidelines in this section. According to NHTSA, a properly installed Child Restraint reduces infant mortality risk by over 70%. For optimal safety, refer to for more information on AAP recommendations and resources for parents and medical professionals. \*\*Child Requirements:\*\* \* Weight: 1.8 - 22.6 kg (4 - 50 lbs) \* Height: 43 - 122 cm (17 - 48 in) \* Head position: Top of child's head is at least 2.5 cm (1 in) or more below the top of the Car Seat Headrest or Shell \*\*Rear-Facing Mode:\*\* \* Age: Infants should remain rear-facing until they reach the maximum height or weight for their Car Seat \* Positioning: Recline Chest Clip at armpit level, shoulder straps at or just below child's shoulders, and head position 2.5 cm (1 in) or more below top of headrest or shell \*\*Forward-Facing Mode:\*\* \* Age: At least 2 years old \* Weight: 10 - 29.4 kg (22 - 65 lbs) \* Height: 72 - 124 cm (28 - 49 in) \* Positioning: Harness Straps must be adjusted to be at or just above child's shoulders Follow installation instructions carefully to ensure the child's safety during sudden stops or crashes. Failure to do so can result in death or serious injury. If there's a conflict between the product and vehicle owner's manual, follow the vehicle owner's manual regarding Car Seat installation. Never leave children unattended while using the Car Seat. Make sure it is not damaged, broken, or missing parts, and that it has been properly installed. Never install or use the seat shell without the base, as it will not restrain the child by itself. Similarly, do not use the base without the seat shell. Always read and follow exactly the instructions accompanying your vehicle and Child Restraint. Children are safer when properly restrained in the rear seating positions than in the front seating positions. Some Car Seats may not fit all vehicles or seating locations; check for a tight installation before using it. Never use this Car Seat in a vehicle seating position where it cannot be secured tightly, as a loosely installed seat will not protect your child in a crash. Only use this Car Seat on forward-facing vehicle seats with backs that lock into place. Forward-facing usage is not recommended under any circumstances due to safety concerns for children under 2 years old, improper headrest adjustments, or vehicle seat belt configurations. Additionally, the Revolve360 Slim must be locked in place while moving and should only rotate during loading and unloading processes. It's crucial to follow specific guidelines for seat belt usage, including locking the vehicle seat belt when installing the car seat and avoiding certain types of lap belts with ELRs. The vehicle seat belt system features different components that work together for optimal safety. The lap belt is tightened by pulling the strap until it's snug, while the automatic locking retractor prevents the belt from loosening once buckled. For Lap/Shoulder Belts with Locking Latch Plates or Sliding Latch Plates with Retractors, the belt can be locked at the shoulder retractor by slowly pulling out the webbing. Always consult your vehicle's owner manual for specific instructions. It's essential to use a Locking Clip in certain vehicles built before 1996 that have sliding latch plates and emergency locking retractors. For newer vehicles (1996 or later), a Locking Clip is typically not required, as the belt can be locked when tightened. However, if your vehicle needs a Locking Clip, you must install it properly to ensure adult or child safety. When not using the Car Seat with the vehicle seat belt, remove the Locking Clip to allow proper restraint for adults or children. Remember, proper installation and use of the Locking Clip can prevent serious injury or death.
