

Washing of the Feet– Holy Thursday

Let those who have eyes to see, see ... ears to hear, hear. Simple enough, huh? All it requires is a faith and trust in God that continually grows ... because of a faith and trust in God. Not always so simple!

It is about finding those persons the Holy Spirit wants me to find. And that takes a mutual faith and trust between me and those chosen, and a faith and trust in God.

The theme for each participant this year is "I walk with the Lord: God is the center of my being." The priest will wash the *feet* just as Christ did as the ultimate gesture of service rendered in love.

Please join us on Holy Thursday to celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper and to 'participate' in the washing of the feet – for these twelve men know that they represent you – the St. Rose community. *Dorothy K. Moran*

Satan and Temptation

In the Gospel of the First Sunday of Lent, we heard of Jesus' temptation by Satan. As we are getting through Lent, it's good for us to remember that our Lenten discipline has as one of its ends to become stronger spiritually. One of the ways that we become stronger is to be stronger in resisting the temptations of Satan. So, this might be a good time to review what our faith teaches us about Satan. To begin with, it is important to understand that Satan (or the Devil, or Lucifer, or similar names) is not an abstraction. Our faith teaches us definitively that Satan and the fallen angels are real beings. The Church teaches that Satan was at first a good angel, made by God. Scripture speaks of a sin of these angels which consisted in an irrevocable rejection of God and his reign. Because of the irreversible nature of their sin, they were banished from God's presence forever. Hell is the traditional term for the "place" (actually a state of being) outside of the presence of God. Incidentally, that Church teaches that the chief punishment of hell is not as much physical pain (although that exists) as it is being deprived of God's presence for eternity. This may not seem like much now, but upon judgment when we meet God face to face and finally see him in all his glory, the eternal memory of the damned of what they have lost by choosing against God in their earthly lives tortures them forever. I don't mean to be melodramatic, it's what we believe.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus states that Satan is, "A murderer from the beginning...a liar and the father of lies." Satan is the "deceiver of the whole world," according to the book of Revelation and is the one who opposes God and his work of salvation accomplished in Christ. He is the seductive voice that tempted our first parents, who having listened to him, caused the human race to fall into death. As Sacred Scripture tell us, "The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil." But all is not lost.

The Catechism brings to us a teaching filled with hope. *"The power of Satan is, nonetheless, not infinite. He is only a creature, powerful from the fact that he is pure spirit, but still a creature. He cannot prevent the building up of God's reign. Although Satan may act in the world out of hatred for God and his kingdom in Christ Jesus, and although his action may cause grave injuries - of a spiritual nature and, indirectly, even of a physical nature - to each man and to society, the action is permitted by divine providence which with strength and gentleness guides human and cosmic history. It is a great mystery that providence should permit diabolical activity, but 'we know that in everything God works for good with those who love him." (CCC 395)*

As stronger than us may Satan be, Christ is infinitely stronger than Satan. If, as St. Paul says, "sin brings death," it was our Lord Jesus who conquered death and sin and evil. Satan was no match for his Creator; Jesus conquered him definitively upon his resurrection. Although we must struggle against Satan and his seductive voice prodding our weaknesses, urging us to go against truth and love and goodness, we needn't despair. In Christ is victory over evil, sin and Satan. As St. James writes, "Submit yourselves to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you." (James 4:7-8) As we continue our Lenten season, may we seek to strengthen ourselves against evil by drawing ever nearer to our Lord.

Following the practice of the early Church, particular readings have been assigned for these Sundays to provide striking examples of conversion for the candidates to contemplate. The Scrutinies are meant uncover and then heal that which is weak and sinful in the hearts of the candidates and to bring out, then strengthen all that is strong and good.

This third Scrutiny Gospel Reading recounts Jesus' most powerful miracle, the raising of Lazarus from the dead. This miracle testifies to Jesus' power over sin and death, a power that our elect will experience in the waters of Baptism. The prayers of the Scrutinies are supports from the Church to fight off their doubt and give them the strength they need as they begin their final preparation for the sacraments. 

The Chrism Mass is held during Holy Week in every Catholic diocese. During this mass, the priests, deacons and representatives of the entire diocesan community gather around their Bishop, who blesses the Holy Oils for use in the coming year. These are:

Oil of the Sick, Oil of Catechumens and Sacred Chrism Whenever the Holy Oils are used in a diocese, the ministry of the Bishop who consecrated them is symbolically present.

Unity, Renewal of Vows and Promises

The Chrism Mass reminds us of our oneness in Christ through Baptism and its holy anointing, made possible by the ministry of the Bishop and his priests. The Chrism mass is also a key moment in which the unity of the Bishop with his priests (together, they form the *presbyterate*) is manifested and renewed. During the liturgy, the entire assembly is called to renew its baptismal promises; deacons and priests also renew their vow of obedience to the local Bishop and their commitment to serve God's people. At the end of the Chrism Mass, the Holy Oils are brought back to parishes of the diocese for use in the coming year.
