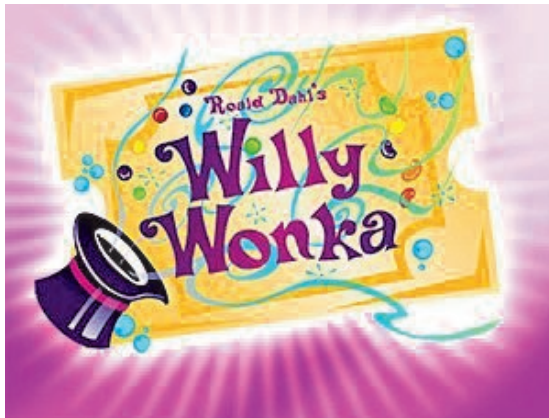

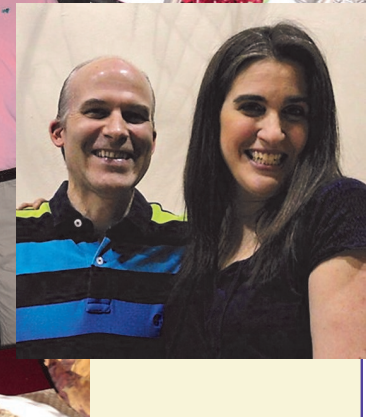

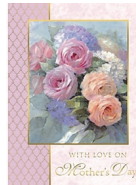

## **Spiritual Center Library**

*"It is fallen from ancient splendor. The bonds of discipline have been gradually relaxed. Studies are abandoned. Teachers as well as students have lost all love of letters. Respect for rules have been replaced with passion, political hate and controversy, sometimes fanaticism and immoral habits."* -St. Thomas Aquinas in reference to the University of Paris (the Sorbonne) in the 13th century.

In most countries, education is influenced by the culture of the people within. Some cultures, even today, suppress women. Some cultures are very poor and cannot sustain an education for the people. Western cultures have been blessed with great thinkers and educators who have lifted the standards of the people, sometimes, however, with false conceptions and errors in morality and religion. Hence, we have societies that are educated yet immoral. Thomas Aquinas, Ignatius of Loyola and other saints and doctors of the church have labored hard to correct these errors. Today, many teachers and parents also work hard to educate students by presenting interesting lessons intertwined with respect for all human life, born and unborn, and by accenting the primacy of the family also by promoting values of piety, honesty, excellence, responsibility, etc. The "Home Schooling" movement has been a wonderful solution to some cultural problems. These thoughts are from a unique audio tape in our Spiritual Center Library entitled, "Why Home Schooling Matters: All Cultures Are Not Equal" #194 by Fr. John A. Perricone.
