Pentecost

The Church celebrates Pentecost as the day on which the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary gathered in the "upper room" fulfilling Jesus' promise to send the Advocate who would guide the Church into all truth. The feast is called "Pentecost" since it is fifty days after Easter (from the Greek pentekostos which means "fifty"). Pentecost is also the official end of the Easter Season. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red, as a reminder of the flames that came down and rested on the Apostles and the Blessed Mother. After Pentecost, the Easter candle is moved from next to the Ambo (where the Word of God is proclaimed) to near the baptismal font. It is only then lit at baptisms and funerals, calling to mind the new life ushered in at the resurrection of Christ. The Holy Spirit gave the apostles gifts of grace through which they would undertake the evangelical mission of the Church.

The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit as listed in the Catechism of the Catholic Church are: Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord. The Catechism teaches us that "The moral life of Christians is sustained by the gifts of the Holy Spirit. These are permanent dispositions which make man docile in following the promptings of the Holy Spirit." (CCC §1830)

You may have also noticed a "Sequence" that was sung today that came after the second reading and before the Gospel Alleluia. The Sequence is a type of ancient liturgical hymn that has been preserved in the Mass during special Feasts. The Sequence is designed to highlight and add solemnity to these celebrations. There is a Sequence also for Christmas, Easter, and Corpus Christi.

House of Charity update

While we do our best to keep the church locked and secure when it is not being used, it seems that someone has more than once removed money from the poor boxes and candle money boxes. Please pray for this desperate person who has taken a pretty significant risk to do this. All of the money that is collected from our poor boxes goes directly to the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. I am not sure how much money they are out, but please keep this in mind the next time there is a donation request from the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. They are the ones who directly aid our own parishioners who have fallen on hard times.
