As has been said by many people smarter than I.....you have to be alive to enjoy education, universal healthcare, tax reform, etc.

The inviolability of the person which is a reflection of the absolute inviolability of God, finds its primary and fundamental expression in the inviolability of human life. Above all, the common outcry, which is justly made on behalf of human rights-for example, the right to health, to home, to work, to family, to culture- is false and illusory if the right to life, the most basic and fundamental right and the condition for all other personal rights, is not defended with maximum determination. Pope Saint John Paul II, *Christifideles Laici* (1988), no. 38

When a parliamentary or social majority decrees that it is legal, at least under certain conditions, to kill unborn human life, is it not really making a tyrannical decision with regard to the weakest and most defenseless of human beings?....While public authority can sometimes choose not to put a stop to something which were it prohibited would cause more serious harm, it can never presume to legitimize as a right of individuals even if they are the majority of the members of society an offense against other persons caused by the disregard of so fundamental a right as the right to life. Pope Saint John Paul II, *Evangelium Vitae* (1995), no.70, 71.

It is impossible to further the common good without acknowledging and defending the right to life, upon which all the other inalienable rights of individuals are founded and from which they develop. A society lacks solid foundations when, on the one hand, it asserts values such as the dignity of the person, justice and peace, but then, on the other hand, radically acts to the contrary by allowing or tolerating a variety of ways in which human life is devalued and violated, especially where it is weak or marginalized. Only respect for life can be the foundation and guarantee of the most precious and essential goods of society, such as democracy and peace. Pope Saint John Paul II, *Evangelium Vitae* (1995), no. 101

And in a final note, this is how Archbishop Charles Chaput, the Archbishop of Philadelphia thinks about Catholics and voting..."I can only speak in terms of my own personal views. I certainly can't vote for somebody who's either pro-choice or pro-abortion. I'm not a Republican and I'm not a Democrat. I'm registered as an independent, because I don't think the church should be identified with one party or another. As an individual and voter I have deep personal concerns about any party that supports changing the definition of marriage, supports abortion in all circumstances, wants to restrict the traditional understanding of religious freedom. Those kinds of issues cause me a great deal of uneasiness."

Report Sexual Abuse

An independent, toll-free number has been established by the Diocese of Camden to help callers report cases of sexual abuse by priests, religious, employees and/or volunteers. Calls are handled by a licensed clinical social worker. In accord with state law, cases of child sexual abuse are reported to the N.J. Division of Youth and Family Services and law enforcement. For information or to inquire about counseling and support services, call 1-800-964-6588.

Child and Youth Protection

The Office of Child and Youth Protection is announcing CAP (Child Assault Prevention) sessions. CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the Diocese of Camden is that adults will attend CAP once every five years.

CAP 1 teaches attendees to **recognize child abuse and neglect** and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees.

CAP 2 is called **CAP's Bullying Prevention Program** and is a workshop addressing bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyber-bullying is also presented.

CAP 3 is called **Cyber-Empowerment** and is a workshop which promotes adults understanding of cyber activity of youth while teaching them realistic ways to help children keep their own rights and guard the rights of others in the cyber-sphere.

Each presentation is 90 minutes.

Adults who are new employees or volunteers MUST attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2 or CAP 3. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1, 2 or 3 when they renew their CAP. The following sessions will be offered in **October 2016**:

Spiritual Center Library

Recently, we celebrated the feast day of St. Jerome, a "Doctor of the Church" and translator of the Bible from Hebrew to Latin and the New Testament from Latin to Modern Latin. Combined, these translations became known as the "Vulgate" and were read by the Church until 1979. These translations were a huge undertaking, took several years to complete and earned him the title "Patron of Scholars," and "Patron of Librarians." Although the Bible was written over 1000 years ago, many of the lessons and situations are still relevant today. For instance, in Acts 20:7-9, we read about a young man who fell asleep at a church meeting and fell out a window! In Acts 19:19, there was a "Book Burning Party." Most can relate to the stories of "The Prodigal Son," "The Good Samaritan," and "The Lost Sheep." The Psalms are popular and versatile. There is one almost for every situation! In our Spiritual Center Library, we have several books, videos, and audio tapes about the books of the Bible. We have the Bible itself recorded on tapes for those who cannot read. Bedridden patients seem to like these. We have interesting Scripture Studies on videos, ideal for Bible Study Classes or Prayer Groups. On our "Free Table" are Bibles that you may keep. You will appreciate the Mass better if you understand the scripture readings.
