n a recession companies need more than ever to examine how their working environment is impacting their performance. Feng Shui is a holistic design discipline originating from ancient China that acknowledges the role of nature's energies in space and time on our wellbeing, happiness and levels of luck and success. Master Sarah McAllister provides some basic pointers on good Feng Shui in the workplace.

1. Open and bright reception area stimulates good "chi"

It is so important to have a strong reception area that is ergonomically arranged, welcoming and light. It is the first impression for both staff and visitors alike and can either be energising or depressing and limiting.

2. The Power Position increases confidence

You will feel more in control of a meeting if you sit in the corner diagonally opposite the entrance door.

3. Supporting your back increases concentration levels

Subconsciously we prefer to have our backs covered, so that we can see people approaching us. Move a filing cabinet or invest in a trough of plants to place behind you to create some privacy and protection if you have no wall.

4. Aligning to pure chi improves decision-making

Take a regular orienteering compass and ensure that your desk faces a pure direction either cardinal or subcardinal, rather than the divide between one direction and another as this causes indecision.

5. Water protects you from Electrosmog

Regularly misting your work area with mineral water spray helps to clear the air of static and also counteracts dryness caused by air conditioning units. Keeping a small glass of water between you and large machines will help protect you against the EMF pollution but DO NOT DRINK the water – just refresh it once a week.



6. Greenery increases relaxation and boosts customer spending

Creating a green oasis of live planting helps to clean the air, as plants provide oxygen during the day and bring lifeforce into a workplace – opt for large smooth rounded leaves or elegant soft fronded palms rather than spiky yuccas. It is scientifically proven that greenery in malls increases customer spending.

7. Daylight increases happiness

Full spectrum lights are far preferable to ordinary yellowish/red lightbulbs, because they mimic natural daylight by up to 97% - very useful in basement offices.

the history of feng shull
