

## **GDPR: DATA PRIVACY NOTICE FOR CLIENTS AND SUPPLIERS**

Great Barr Auto Recovery Limited T/A Beeches Recovery ("We") are committed to protecting and respecting your privacy.

This policy (together with our terms of use as per our website <a href="www.beeches.co.uk">www.beeches.co.uk</a> (GDPR DATA PRIVACY NOTICE) and any other documents referred to on it) sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you, or that you provide to us, will be processed by us. Please read the following carefully to understand our views and practices regarding your personal data and how we will treat it.

The rules on processing of personal data are set out in the General Data Protection Regulation (the "GDPR").

#### 1. Definitions

**Data controller** - A controller determines the purposes and means of processing personal data.

**Data processor** - A processor is responsible for processing personal data on behalf of a controller.

**Data subject** – Natural person

## Categories of data: Personal data and special categories of personal data

**Personal data** - The GDPR applies to 'personal data' meaning any information relating to an identifiable person who can be directly or indirectly identified in particular by reference to an identifier (as explained in Article 6 of GDPR). For example name, passport number, home address or private email address. Online identifiers include IP addresses and cookies.

**Special categories personal data -** The GDPR refers to sensitive personal data as 'special categories of personal data' (as explained in Article 9 of GDPR). The special categories specifically include genetic data, and biometric data where processed to uniquely identify an individual. Other examples include racial and ethnic origin, sexual orientation, health data, trade union membership, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs.

**Processing -** means any operation or set of operations which is performed on personal data or on sets of personal data, whether or not by automated means, such as collection, recording, organisation, structuring, storage, adaptation or alteration, retrieval, consultation, use, disclosure by transmission, dissemination or otherwise making available, alignment or combination, restriction, erasure or destruction.

**Third party** - means a natural or legal person, public authority, agency or body other than the data subject, controller, processor and persons who, under the direct authority of the controller or processor, are authorised to process personal data.

#### 2. Who are we?

Great Barr Auto Recovery Limited T/A Beeches Recovery and its appointed Data Protection Officer/Data Representative is the data controller. ## 3. The purpose(s) of processing your personal data

We use your personal data for the following purposes:

• **Performance of Contract** - this means processing your data where it is necessary for the performance of a contract to which you are a party or to take steps at your request before entering into such a contract.



- Legitimate Interest this means the interest of our business in conducting and managing our business to enable us to give you the best service/product and the most secure experience. We make sure we consider and balance any potential impact on you (both positive and negative) and your rights before we process your personal data for our legitimate interests. We do not use your personal data for activities where our interests are overridden by the impact on you (unless we have your consent or are otherwise required or permitted to by law). You can obtain further information about how we assess our legitimate interests against any potential impact on you in respect of specific activities by contacting us using contact details provided above.
- **Comply with a legal or regulatory obligation -** this means processing your personal data where it is necessary for compliance with a legal or regulatory obligation that we are subject to.

GENERALLY, WE DO NOT RELY ON CONSENT AS A LEGAL BASIS FOR PROCESSING YOUR PERSONAL DATA OTHER THAN IN RELATION TO SENDING THIRD PARTY DIRECT MARKETING COMMUNICATIONS TO YOU VIA EMAIL OR TEXT MESSAGE. YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO WITHDRAW CONSENT TO MARKETING AT ANY TIME BY CONTACTING US (DATA PROTECTION OFFICER OR DATA PRESENTATIVE) USING CONTACT DETAILS AS GIVEN ABOVE.

## 4. The categories of personal data concerned

With reference to the categories of personal data described in the definitions section, we process the following categories of your data:

#### Personal Data

- **Identity Data** includes first name/last name/username/marital status/title/date of birth/gender.
- Contact Data includes billing address/delivery address/email address/ telephone numbers.

WE ALSO COLLECT, USE AND SHARE **AGGREGATED DATA** SUCH AS STATISTICAL OR DEMOGRAPHIC DATA FOR ANY PURPOSE. AGGREGATED DATA MAY BE DERIVED FROM YOUR PERSONAL DATA BUT IS NOT CONSIDERED PERSONAL DATA IN LAW AS THIS DATA DOES **NOT** DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY REVEAL YOUR IDENTITY. FOR EXAMPLE, WE MAY AGGREGATE YOUR USAGE DATA TO CALCULATE THE PERCENTAGE OF USERS ACCESSING A SPECIFIC WEBSITE FEATURE. HOWEVER, IF WE COMBINE OR CONNECT AGGREGATED DATA WITH YOUR PERSONAL DATA SO THAT IT CAN DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY IDENTIFY YOU, WE TREAT THE COMBINED DATA AS PERSONAL DATA WHICH WILL BE USED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS PRIVACY NOTICE.

We do not collect any **Special Categories of Personal Data** about you (this includes details about your race or ethnicity, religious or philosophical beliefs, sex life, sexual orientation, political opinions, trade union membership, information about your health and genetic and biometric data). Nor do we collect any information about criminal convictions and offences.

## 5. What is our legal basis for processing your personal data?

## 6. Sharing your personal data

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and will be shared only with parties that are necessary for the performance of supply of goods and service either bought by us from you or sold to you by us.

# 7. How long do we keep your personal data?

We keep your personal data for no longer than reasonably necessary (no longer than six years after the end of relationship) in order to deal with any legal claims/complaints.

## 8. Providing us with your personal data

You are under no statutory or contractual requirement or obligation to provide us with your personal data. But failure to do so will have the following consequences:

We may not be able to provide you with our goods and services and you may not be able to supply us your goods and services to us.

## 9. Your rights and your personal data

Unless subject to an exemption under the GDPR, you have the following rights with respect to your personal data:

- The right to request a copy of the personal data which we hold about you;
- The right to request that we correct any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary to retain such data:
- The right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time, where consent was your lawful basis for processing the data;
- The right to request that we provide you with your personal data and where possible, to transmit
  that data directly to another data controller, (known as the right to data portability), (where
  applicable i.e. where the processing is based on consent or is necessary for the performance of a
  contract with the data subject and where the data controller processes the data by automated
  means);
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing;
- The right to object to the processing of personal data, (where applicable i.e. where processing is based on legitimate interests (or the performance of a task in the public interest/exercise of official authority); direct marketing and processing for the purposes of scientific/historical research and statistics).

#### 10. Transfer of Data Abroad

We do not transfer personal data outside the EEA.

## 11. Automated Decision Making
