The area boasts numerous coffee shops, parks, and highly-rated public schools. Residents tend to be conservative, with the township ranking as one of the best places to live in Michigan. Brighton Charter Township is a charter township located in Livingston County, Michigan, with a population of approximately 19,144 as of 2020. The township is situated in the southeastern part of the county and borders Oakland County to the east. It shares an administrative boundary with the city of Brighton, which is located adjacent to the township but has its own government. The township covers a total area of 34.6 square miles, with 33.0 square miles of land and 1.6 square miles of water. The terrain features streams that flow west and southwest, part of the Huron River watershed leading to Lake Erie. Brighton Township is home to various notable attractions, including General Motors' Milford Proving Ground in the northeast part of the township. According to the 2020 census, the racial makeup of the population was predominantly White, with smaller percentages of African American, Native American, Asian, and Hispanic or Latino residents. The township has a relatively high average household size of 2.96 people per household, with a median home value of \$255,100. Over 66% of homes are assessed within a specific price range, while around 17.6% of the population do not have to pay rent or mortgage payments. Overall, Brighton Charter Township offers a unique blend of rural and urban characteristics, with its proximity to major cities like Detroit and Lansing. The township's economy is driven primarily by housing and related expenses, with a median household income of \$93,327 in 2010. The population distribution is relatively evenly spaced among different age groups, with 30% under the age of 18, 6% between 18-24, and 27.7% from 45-64. The median income for males was \$64,775 compared to \$33,328 for females. The per capita income stood at \$36,151, with about 2.5% of the population living below the poverty line. Students in Brighton Township predominantly attend local schools such as the Brighton Area Schools and Hartland Consolidated Schools. Additionally, there are Christian schools like Cornerstone Christian School and Charyl Stockwell Academy, as well as St. Patrick's Catholic school which maintains a traditional Catholic curriculum with religious elements incorporated into the studies.
