RURAL INTERVENTION SPECIALIZED CASE MANAGEMENT

In Elbert and Lincoln county, the JAC collaborates with the Elbert and Lincoln County Inter-agency Oversight Group (known as Connections for Families and RISE) and the 18th Judicial District Senate Bill 94 Program to provide Rural Intervention Specialized Case Management (RISC). RISC helps children, youth and their families connect to resources, which benefits their goals of successors is an early intervention process designed to meet community needs which are focused on the needs of children and youth before proceeding with the juvenile court system. Services may include therapeutic, mentoring, family, and/or school support. Recommendations may include referral to the Services Review Team (SRT) or Lincoln – Service Review Team (L-SRT). The goal of a SRT and L-SRT meeting is to develop an action plan to address the complex issues and safety needs of youth and families. The Rural Integrated Case Management Specialist is a member of the SRT and L-SRT and informs treatment and/or service recommendations.
