Introduction

When you look at manufacturing job postings, you need to explore if the work will fit your needs. A job posting doesn't always have all the information you need (some questions you'll need to ask during a job interview), but it will give you a clue as to whether you should consider an employment opportunity seriously.

Things to look for in a job posting include:

Location: Is there an address listed or a map? Can you get to this job? Is it on a bus route or close to where you live?

Responsibilities: Do you understand the activities you'd be involved in? Can you do the physical tasks? Will you be standing for long hours? Will you be lifting heavy objects?

Qualifications: Do you have the skills that are needed to do the job?

Hours: What are the working hours? Is it a part-time or full-time position? Will you be working during the day, at night or on weekends?

Wages: Does the starting pay cover your financial needs?

Education: Do you have the level of schooling that's required?

Training: Does the position come with on-the-job training to teach you specific tasks?

Supports: Do they offer accommodations if you have special needs?

Extras: Do they offer health benefits or other bonuses? Do they talk about future possibilities?






