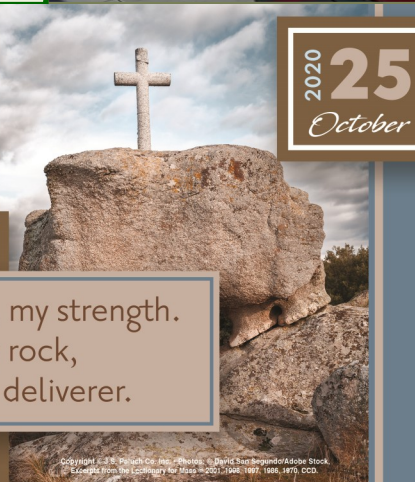

BEATIFICATION OF FR. MICHAEL MCGIVNEY, FOUNDER OF THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

The founder of the Knights of Columbus, Father Michael J. McGivney was a central figure in the growth of Catholicism in America, and he remains a model today. His example of charity, evangelization and empowerment of the laity continues to bear fruit and guide Knights of Columbus around the world.

His heroic virtue was recognized in 2008 by the Vatican, which named him a Venerable Servant of God, and on May 26, 2020, Pope Francis approved a decree for a miracle attributed to his intercession, opening the way for Father McGivney to be beatified on Oct. 31, 2020. A second approved miracle is needed for him to be canonized as a saint of the Catholic Church.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS (K of C) COUNCIL 9714

—An In-Person/Communal Vigil of Adoration, Friday, October 30th, from 7:30-8:30pm, in the Church to be led by the Chaplain and selected members from the Council Officers. Clergy Members are being invited to the Adoration. The adoration can also be broadcasted for those who are unable to be present.

—At the Closing OUTDOOR MASS the following day, Saturday, October 31st at 10am, the culmination of the Holy Rosary Month (per Our Lady of Fatima's message), a portrait/image of Blessed McGivney will be enshrined near the altar. Clergy are invited to concelebrate. At this mass, the original image of Our Lady of Fatima, who would already be on her customized carrier, will be positioned in the bottom steps by the St. Augustine's shrine. A prayer on the Beatification of Blessed McGivney will be said after Communion and a petition will also be included in the Prayers of the Faithful. After the mass, the procession of the images of Our Lady of Fatima and Blessed McGivney, carried by the members of K of C, will follow around the Church. After the procession, the images will be positioned in the bottom steps by St. Augustine's Shrine for Veneration by the clergy and the faithful.

—All K of C Members, since Council 9714 began in 1988, are going to be invited to these liturgical events – a beautiful moment and opportunity to renew the spirit of Blessed McGivney in every K of C of St. Augustine Church, both active and not so active members of K of C Council 9714.

WASHINGTON—Earlier this year, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Ad Hoc Committee Against Racism and Loyola Press published **Everyone Belongs**, an **illustrated children's book addressing racism**. Today, it was announced that the book has been awarded a gold medal in the Religion/Spirituality category of the 2020 Moonbeam Children's Book Awards. *Everyone Belongs*, inspired by the November 2018 statement of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (*Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love, A Pastoral Letter Against Racism*), empowers young readers to reflect on the dignity of the human person created in God's image and the reality of racism in our society. Intended for children ages 5-12, *Everyone Belongs* helps young readers explore potential solutions, reconciliation, and healing. Launched in 2007 by the Jenkins Group, the Moonbeam Children's Book Awards are intended to bring increased recognition to exemplary children's books and their creators. *Everyone Belongs* may be purchased online at LoyolaPress.com/EveryoneBelongs. VOCATIONS AWARENESS WEEK, Nov.1 - 7

Vocations Awareness Week in the Archdiocese of San Francisco from November 1st to November 7th. It is a week-long observance in the Catholic Church in the United States for promoting and praying for vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life.

The Office of Vocations will be sponsoring and promoting a prayer campaign that simply involves praying a short prayer each day so that the Catholic faithful in the Archdiocese may be open to a possible religious vocation.

Is it permissible for a priest or a member of a religious order to publicly endorse a candidate for elected office? *Should* a priest or a member of a religious order publicly endorse a candidate for public office?

In the church's official Code of Canon Law, Canon 287 also states that priests "are not to have an active part in political parties and in governing labor unions unless, in the judgment of competent ecclesiastical authority, the protection of the rights of the Church or the promotion of the common good requires it."

In "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship," the U.S.C.C.B. has always stressed that the role of priests and religious is to help people weigh church teaching, their individual conscience and the various pros and cons of each candidate before voting. This careful policy has often allowed the Catholic church in the U.S. to stay out of the political fray, even when one of the major political parties has a Catholic on the ticket (which has been the case this year and in the past four presidential elections).

Merciful Father, Thank you for inviting each of us to join in your work of building the kingdom of love, justice, and peace. Draw us close to you in prayer as we discern your call in our families and communities. Send us forth to encounter all whom you love: those not yet born, those in poverty, those in need of welcome. Inspire us to respond to the call to faithful citizenship, during election season and beyond. Help us to imitate your charity and compassion and to serve as models of loving dialogue. Teach us to treat others with respect, even when we disagree, and seek to share your love and mercy. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen.
