STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION Wis 11:22-12:2; Ps 145:1-2, 8-11, 13-14; 2 Thes 1:11-2:2; Lk 19:1-10

In the Gospel Reading from St. Luke we hear the story of the tax collector Zaccheus and his desire to see and perhaps meet Jesus. The image of Zaccheus up in that sycamore tree is one that many of us may recall from our childhood, and hearing itbecause it is a vivid impression and one that even as we get older may-trigger a memory.

The name Zaccheus means "pure one," but he certainly was not pure. We learn from his own confession how he has overcharged and cheated people in his tax collection duties. However, for all his faults and shortcomings Zaccheus seeks purity, and he understands that Jesus is a way to achieve that. It is interesting to note that Zaccheus climbs a tree to see Jesus better. That sounds like something a child might do, and that fulfills in a small way an instruction Jesus gives to each of us, "Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven." Jesus follows that remark by imme-

GOD IS WITH US

The book of Wisdom tells us that the spirit of God is in all things. What a wonderful thought, and what a wonderful image to keep in front of us as we travel down life's road. For if the path is revealed in the treading, it's good to know that God is with us-and all around us-every step of the way.

But Paul knows that this divine presence is not timid. Instead, God calls out to us, and Paul prays that we, along with the Thessalonians, might be made worthy of that call. And who knows more about God's call than Zacchaeus, the tax collector? Jesus called him out of a tree, for goodness' sake. diately reminding us that we must become humble like children.

That is a cue for us to recall importance of humility when it comes to being a good steward, but thanls to the lesson of Zaccheus we learn even more about how to seek stewardship. Like the tax collector we need to make an effort to seek Jesus; like him we must be humble; we must welcome Jesus into our homes and into our hearts; and finally we need to receive him joyfully. —Catholic Stewardship Consultants


