Ninth Day Novena to St. Augustine Reflection By Monina Carlos

What can we do in our lives so that our values and purpose are aligned with St. Augustine's?

As a Lector, I started going to Bible Study class in order to better understand the Word that I was proclaiming at mass. I struggled for understanding in those early months and I struggle even now. I came to realize that my thoughts and actions were not lining up together. I would think one way but act another. There must be a balance – an alignment of His Will with my own. I needed an "alignment", otherwise, change doesn't happen.

The purpose you bring your car in for alignment is to ensure that your vehicle's travel is straight without pulling to one side or the other. The alignment will keep your travel safe, your wheels from uneven wear, your gas burning efficiently and your ride smooth. Our spiritual lives can also get out of alignment. The result of being out of alignment will be confusion and frustration. God's word does not produce confusion, it produces peace.

St. Augustine reminds us that we cannot find happiness except in God alone and ultimately we should place all our hope in Him. When we are united with God, we will be able to order all things rightly - we will be able to order all things to the Divine Being. Our true happiness lies in ordering all things to God so that we might enjoy Him even while we are still here on earth.

So how do we align our thoughts with Gods? What can we do in our own lives so that our values and purpose are aligned with God's?

We need to have a working knowledge of His Word. We have to read, meditate and study the Word of God. Knowledge is good but we must also put into practice what His Word tells us.

We have to commit our daily life and all we do unto God. By committing the things we do and say to the Lord, we will find peace and joy!

We have to make God first in our thought life – I've made it a habit that when I open my eyes in the morning, I say "Good morning Father." I want Him to be my very first thought of the day.

We must pray without ceasing and be thankful in everything. The apostle Paul tells us to pray continuously and be thankful in everything (1 Thess 5:17, 18). Having a grateful heart reminds us of how blessed we are. Praying keeps us with an active connection with our Heavenly Father.

Obviously, we will never be able to think like God but we can develop a Christ-like mindset. God's Words tell us that His thoughts are not our thoughts. That means He is above our thoughts – and so He should be. He is God after all. What we are needing to align our thoughts to His, is our mindset. It takes practice. It is only then that we will see changes in our life. By keeping our thoughts and actions in alignment with God we find the peace we've been searching for and we experience what joy really is.
