## **ONLY WONDER KNOWS:** HUMANITY'S IRRE-SISTIBLE ATTRACTION TO THE MYSTERY OF CREATION

Taught live online via Zoom on Mondays at 7 p.m. on November 16 2020, November 30, December 14, January 4 2021, January 18. Recordings will be available to all who register.

How can we understand physical reality while being in it? Why is there something instead of nothing? Join Dr. Maria Élena Monzani, astrophysicist at the SLAC particle accelerator at Stanford, with Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone and other great minds as we explore these big guestions and more. A recurring theme in our daily conversations is the apparent conflict between different methods for understanding nature and ourselves: faith, philosophy, science, medicine, sociology, psychology, etc. All these methods have one factor in common: they are driven by human curiosity, and by an attitude of amazement towards reality. But how is it even possible that we are able to understand physical reality, while being a part of it? In this course, we will examine this question from a variety of different viewpoints and discuss how, instead of contradicting each other, all these methods paint a coherent picture of humanity's relationship with the cosmos.

### THE CATHOLIC FAITH & MODERN SCIENCE

Are faith and science opposed to each other? Do miracles matter? Can physics explain creation without a creator? What is consciousness? Does evolution contradict the faith?

Taught live online via Zoom on Tuesdays at 7 p.m. on February 2nd 2021, 9th, 16th, 23rd, March 2nd 7-8:30. Recordings will be available to all who register.

Join us for an online course taught by theoretical particle physicist and president of the Society of Catholic Scientists, Dr. Stephen Barr, as we explore these questions and many more! In these lectures Prof. Barr will show that the widespread idea that faith and science are opposed to each other is based on serious misconceptions about the history of science, about what the Catholic Church teaches, and about what science has actually discovered about the world. In the first lecture, he will show how fundamental Catholic beliefs about God dovetail with the basic assumptions of science. In the second lecture, he will show how the Catholic Church, Catholic clergy, and Catholic lay people powerfully contributed to the founding and development of science. In the third lecture, he will discuss the beginning and creation of the universe from the viewpoint of both Catholic theology and modern cosmology. In the fourth lecture, he will show that the idea of the human "spiritual soul" is not in conflict with modern science. In the final lecture he will show how the idea of biological evolution is perfectly consistent with a Christian conception of the universe.
