Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus.

— Philippians 2:5

NECESSARY REPETITION

Spiritual teachers tend to repeat themselves, and to repeat other teachers. Maybe there really aren't that many different truths to tell. Just a lot of slow, sleepy human beings—like us—who need to hear the basics over and over. Consider today's readings.

People complain that God isn't "fair," and Ezekiel answers that God is more than fair. People choose their own fates, and people can change. Even evildoers can turn, do right, and live. "Actions speak louder than words." A fresh new insight? Hardly.

Paul tells the Philippians he would truly be encouraged if those who claimed to be believers would, in fact, look to others' interests and not their own. "The proof of the pudding is in the eating." A novel idea? I don't think so.

In Jesus' story of the farmer and his sons, everyone knows the one who said he wouldn't work—but did—is way ahead of the one who said he would work, but didn't. "Talk is cheap." Heard that before?

MSGR. JUAN A. ALARCON, JR. † January 1, 1938 - September 21, 2014

Rev. Msgr. Juan Alarcon, Jr., passed away last Sunday due to heart failure at Seton Medical Center, Daly City.

He began coming to the U.S. in the 1980s to visit his siblings and late mother. In time, he made friends with Msgr. McKay of St. Cecilia Church. Every summer, since then, he helped in the pastoral ministry there.

Upon his retirement in 2001, Fr. Ed Dura welcomed him as a "resident" clergy at St. Anne Church in 2002.

In 2009, Fr. Rene Ramoso invited him to St. Augustine Church. He ministered to the sick, the dying, and to members of bereaved families. He was spiritual director to the Legion of Mary Divine Mercy Praesidium and the Bible Study Group. On first Fridays of the month, he said mass at Atria and Aegis Assisted Living Communities.

"Mons?" as he was popularly addressed, was ordained a priest on April 12, 1964. He belonged to the Archdiocese of Caceres in the Philippines.

His pastoral assignments included being a parochial vicar to three parishes in Naga, Philippines: the Naga Metropolitan Cathedral, the Parish of St. Micahel the Archangel (Caramoan, Camarines Sur), and the Parish and Shrine of our Lady of Peñafrancia. He was Rector of the Holy Rosary Major Seminary in 1984, pastor at Immaculate Conception Parish, then, parish priest of St. Anthony of Padua, Iriga City in 1998.

He was also director of two Archdiocesan Commissions: the Caceres Commission on Communications in 1988 and the Caceres Commission on Education in 1989. He also established the first Caceres Catholic Mass Media Awards.

"Monsi", may your soul rest in peace.

DEACON ROBERT BERTOLANI † July 15, 1936 - September 21, 2014

Deacon Bob Bertolani died peacefully in his home on Sunday, September 21st. He is survived by his wife, Helen; children: Susan, Nancy, and William, and multiple grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Deacon Bob was one of the original parishioners here. He was a member of the original adult choir. He actively participated in the initial capital campaign to have this parish built. In 1990, Bob joined the diaconate program in the Archdiocese of San Francisco and served as the first deacon in charge of the penance service, Seder Meal , and baptismal catechesis in St. Augustine Church. He also supervised the Eucharistic Ministry for many years. He was one hard worker - knew how to care of things from pastoral to electrical , plumbing to gardening.

Deacon Bob retired from St. Augustine sometime in 2007 but continued to say homilies on weekends on some occasion until his health did not allow him to do so.

Rest in peace, Deacon Bob.
