Eye Doctors of Marysille, Inc. Contact Lens Policy

Prior to a contact lens fitting or refitting examination, a patient must have received a full eye examination in the last two years. The total cost of a contact lens fitting varies depending on the type of contacts the patient needs, the complexity of the fitting, and whether or not the patient is a previous contact lens wearer.

Previous contact lens wearers:

Patients who are changing to a different type of contact lens, who want to change to a different brand, or have a large prescription change must be refitted and evaluated. During the contact lens exam, the doctor performs extra tests that are not performed during a routine examination for glasses. The doctor is checking the fit of the contact lenses and the vision with the contacts, making necessary changes. Contact lenses can affect the front of the eye (the cornea), so the cornea is also being evaluated closely with further testing. The fee for the contact lens fitting also includes all follow-ups during a 90 day period and the trial lenses used during the evaluation. The doctor will recommend trial contact lenses and will dispense these to the patient to wear as instructed. The doctor may recommend a follow-up visit to have the contacts evaluated again. When the doctor is satisfied that the patient has a proper fit, then the contact lens prescription will be finalized so that you can order a supply of contacts.
