Community Impact Statement Boys & Girls Club of Johnson City/Washington County 2210 West Market Street Johnson City, TN 37604

Since 1944, Boys & Girls Club of Johnson City/Washington County has been providing area youth with a safe, fun place to be after school, during breaks and over the summer. We are a debt-free United Way Partner Agency with a solid reputation for good stewardship of our resources. When combined, our after school, summer, organized sports and community outreach positively affects over 830 area youth annually. With an average of 20 full and part time staff members, we are able to provide both the manpower and skill sets needed for successful implementation of over 25 high-quality, structured programs promoting academic success, healthy lifestyles and character and leadership development for all who attend.

This year over 95% of our 348 registered after school club members are from LMI households who qualify for free or reduced lunch. On average, 150 of these students join us each weekday; the other 198 utilize us for breaks and days school is closed. 60% are male; 40% are female. 61% self-report as Caucasian, 15% African-American, 9% Hispanic, 1% Asian and 14% as being of two or more races. Aside from members who attend University School or are on extended visits to family in our area, all may receive transportation to our club from school. Many are or have been in the foster care system or are homeless. Nearly all must be treated using Trauma Informed Care protocol due to high Adverse Childhood Experiences scores. Our programs give them the opportunity to see firsthand how they are able to make a difference by helping others in their community, while gaining the organizational and soft skills necessary to be valuable and dependable employees all while building resiliency and having fun.

In addition to in club activities, Boys & Girls Club of Johnson City/Washington County also offers year-round organized sports including T-ball, Coach Pitch, Soccer, Flag Football, and Basketball for ages 3 and up as well as hosting several community sports workshops and clinics. We allow others in the community to use our space when appropriate, and help advocate for other non-profits in our area.
