We are able to annually conduct and assess the quality of our services through the National Youth Outcomes Initiative (NYOI) Survey conducted by Boys & Girls Clubs of America. This survey is specifically designed for Club members of all ages and asks pertinent and targeted questions specifically for each age group. Through the survey we are able to collect valuable data on membership, the overall Club experience and how our members are doing academically, physically and socially. CHARACTER Development

Studies show young people who engage in service do better in school, maintain positive relationships with adults and peers and most importantly, avoid risky behavior. By engaging our members in ongoing volunteer service activities, we provide them with the tools and support needed to become productive, caring and responsible citizens and encourage good character and an appreciation for citizenship.

57% of our members participate in Club based service once a month or more

19% of our members participate in Club based service once a week or more

When compared to their peers, youth who participated in civic engagement programs were:

- Less likely to become pregnant and use drugs
- Less likely to drop out and more likely to graduate from high school
- Observed to have higher rates of school engagement and attendance
- More likely to attend college
- More likely to have more positive attitudes toward work
- More likely to vote as young adults

HEALTHY Achievements



We strive to improve overall health wellness of our members with programs encouraging youth and teens to increase daily physical activity, make smart food choices and strengthen interpersonal skills, positive behavior and good character through social recreation programs. All programs are structured to develop members' capacity to engage in constructive behavior that nurtures their well-being, both physically and emotionally.

93% of our members engage in physical activity

80% engage in physical activity 3 days a week or more while **32%** engage in physical activity 7 days a week

81% consume less than one serving of soda a day while **52%** do not consume any soda per day.
