- About 649,000 animals who enter shelters as strays are returned to their owners. Of those, 542,000 are dogs and only 100,000 are cats.
- I think you'll agree that's scary. I can't decide what's worse...that 7.6 million pets end up in shelters or that less than 10% of them end up being returned to their owners!
