The Holy Spirit Seminar: Notes By Kelly Baker

The Holy Spirit is perhaps the most obscure and misunderstood person of the Trinity. Jesus implied that the Holy Spirit's presence in our lives is better than his own physical presence (see John 16:7). Yet most of us would much rather have Jesus by our side than the Holy Spirit. The hope is that this resource will lead you to more knowledge and intimacy with the Spirit, the treasured person of the God-head.

 Jesus' baptism—Luke 3:21-22 This marks the beginning of Jesus' earthly ministry. Jesus performed his

These verses show that the day of Pentecost was not just some side note, but a tremendously ______ event. Jesus told them the great commission but told them not to go anywhere yet, because they would need the power of the Spirit to fulfill what God wanted them to do.

Quote from <u>The Charismatic Theology of St. Luke</u>: "Peter emphasizes that it is universal in status, not geographical or chronological: it is for the young as well as the old; for the female as well as the male; for slaves as well as free. The prophetic gift of the Spirit is to be no longer restricted to specifically called and endowed charismatic leaders as it was in the Old Testament times. Indeed, in the last days the gift of the Spirit is as potentially universal as the gift of grace (Acts 2:39)"

Now instead of Jesus and only a select few having the power of the Holy Spirit,

have access to this power of the same Holy Spirit. This helps make sense of John 14:12-14.

- What is the purpose of the baptism of the Spirit (Spirit empowerment)?
 - o power to be a witness (Acts 1:8)
 - o strengthens the church (1Cor 14:26)
 - o private tongues (prayer language) is to edify oneself (1Cor 14:4)

The baptism of the Holy Spirit does NOT make you better than others; it just makes you a better, more effective, you.

- Is the Baptism of the Holy Spirit (and the gifts of the Holy Spirit) for today?
 - o Acts 2:38-39
 - o 1 Corinthians 13:8-13
 - Has perfection come? Do we see face to face? Do we know fully?

Gordon Fee quote from <u>Paul, the Spirit and the People of God</u> "Paul would simply not have understood the presence of the Spirit that did not also include such evidences of the Spirit's working that he termed 'powers', which we translate 'miracles' (Galatians 3:5, Romans 15:18-19)...Those who believe in God as creator and sustainer, but who balk at the miraculous both past and present, have created





theological positions for themselves that are difficult to sustain and quite removed from the biblical perspective."

- Is the baptism of the Holy Spirit different from the indwelling of the Holy Spirit received at conversion?
 - o The Samaritan believers Acts 8:14-19
 - o Paul Acts 9:1-19
 - o Believers in Ephesus Acts 19:1-7

These show that the Baptism of the Spirit is distinct from the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, though both are works of the same Holy Spirit.

- What role does speaking in tongues have in the baptism of the Spirit?

[^] We see in v18 that there was definitely outward evidence which Simon the Sorcerer wanted to buy.

- O This is why we may hear so much about speaking in tongues it usually happens! When we ask God to baptize someone in the Holy Spirit, we expect that tongues will be involved in the outward evidence of the inward reality.
- Is it appropriate to ask for the baptism of the Holy Spirit?
 - o Luke 12:31- Seek God first, not his blessings.
 - o Luke 11:9-13 Jesus assures us that when we ask, God will give us *good* gifts!
 - o 1Cor 14:1 Paul instructs the church to "eagerly desire spiritual gifts"

The Holy Spirit is a ______. He rarely forces himself on us. He waits for us to ask and seek; then he shows up. When we do not expect him to show up, or give us supernatural gifts, he probably won't. (Even Jesus could not do miracles in his hometown because of their lack of faith).

- How do I receive this empowerment of the Spirit?
 - o repent _____ turr
 - You should want to do God's will before ask for his power.
 - John 13:1-17; 1Cor 13 You should desire to love those around you
 - o be baptized in _____
 - as an outward, public sign of what has happened inwardly
 - Acts 2:38
 - God and ask in faith
 - Luke 11:9-13 God is the giver, and it is a gift!

^{*} The text does not give details of Paul's baptism in the Spirit so it is impossible to know exactly what happened; but we do know that Paul did speak in tongues from 1 Corinthians 14:18.

- release any fear that he won't show up, or fear that he will show up!
- perhaps ask others to pray for you (laying on of hands)
- o _____ to speak out in tongues
 - when you feel God's presence, continue to press in.
 - partner with the Holy Spirit. Remember, he is a gentleman.
- o _____ in faith, continue to _____.
 - just like we receive our salvation in faith.
 - remember the purposes of the baptism
 - Eph 5:18 a *continual* filling of the Spirit, not just a one-time event.
