

The effectiveness of EAs depends very much on the ability of stake-holders (including the public) to participate in order to ensure that development initiatives consider broad-based concerns.

Public Participation also improves governance since development must consider a wide range of issues that include rural livelihoods, community upliftment, national priorities, the need to conserve the natural environment and the need to maintain ecological functioning.

Yet limited access to resource and information, poor understanding of EA processes and legislation, and limited confidence (or even fear) often limit the capacity of individuals, communities and institutions to participate effectively in EA.

This Course is a culmination of two years of research and analysis by SAIEA's Calabash Project to strengthen one of the weakest aspects of EA in southern Africa—public participation: It provides stakeholders with information on their rights to participate, effective methods of participation, how proponents and governments can improve the way they facilitate participation, and how best EA processes can harness stakeholder energy and knowledge in a positive and constructive way.
