A Christian Point of View on Sacred Time

I was asked to write an article for The Voice about the Christian Calendar, why we have liturgical seasons, and how it came to be that instead of just having one day after another in a monotonous stream, we celebrate different days, and times. So, I'll try.

Many of you will remember that just a generation ago, families would attend church twice on Sunday - for morning and evening services. It was not that long ago that Western culture was organized around what we believed to be foundationally important - the sacred. We believed God was to be found in all times and all places, and so instead of having a secular calendar of days, weeks, months, and years, our calendars followed "sacred" time. Like devout people of different religions, we prayed six times a day: First thing in the morning when we awoke was Matins. Three hours later would be the Lord's Prayer. Three hours later Psalm 23 would be recited, then what was called Nones, then in the evening was Vespers, and before we went to sleep was Compline. Our weeks included a "Sabbath". Our years were marked by "Holy-Days" or holi-days, instead of "Vacant" days, or vacat-ion. Our seasons viewed time through a sacred lens, in an annual cycle of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost, with particular days during those seasons which reminded us of how our lives are marked by dark and light, fullness and emptiness, work and leisure, etc., all part of God. As Christians moved from

hour to hour, through days, and weeks, months and seasons, our ordinary lives were held in a larger story - the story of God's sacred life within us and surrounding us with holiness. We still hold to some of that sense of sacred time with liturgical seasons like Advent when we take four weeks during the darkest time of year to remember that out of darkness. out of the "womb", new life-light emerges every year at Christmas; as days slowly grow longer with more sunlight during January, we slowly (so slowly!) become en-lightened as we see and recognize divinity among us in the person of Jesus; during Lent we are reminded again that our own en-lightenment is so small, and the darkness of the "tomb" is so large; yet, God lives despite what humans do, and shares God's life with us at Easter. At Pentecost, the people of God are invited (again) to participate in God's life. Whether we notice or not, the sacred continues again.




- contaminants in the soil

So, here's to the strength of friendship - here's to our special FELLOWSHIP. Welcome Back!





Memories from Days Gone By

The following is an excerpt from
"The History of the Donway
United Church, 1955 – 1992" lovingly assembled
by Joyce Sullivan and her committee.
This memory was shared by Marion Dunlop.



"It was a stormy, frigid night in late February, as Joyce Sullivan and I surveyed the huge piles of dirty dishes spread out on the counters of the church kitchen. It was the Father and Son banquet of the Boy Scouts, and one hundred people were in the hall having speeches, games and songs. The other women of the U.C.W. had done their part in setting up tables, preparing for the banquet and serving it, and had gone home. Now it was our turn to do the dishes.

It was steaming hot in the kitchen. We tried to open the door, but it was frozen shut, and also the window. We were wearing sweaters and skirts, sooff came the sweaters. We would do the hot job with bare arms, but that was all right, because we had slips on. In the next minute, in came Berna Hull, followed by a man to examine a misfunctioning stove. Quickly we grabbed dish towels and tied them around our necks to cover our slip-covered bosoms. The man and Berna conferred about the stove and left, so we pulled off the dish towels and went to our task again. In five minutes, Berna and the repair man appeared again. On went the dish towels with great dispatch – we were used to it by then! They soon left, and we finished the dishes in our state of undress. Oh! The good old days, when we were young and energetic!"



St Mark's Presbyterian

Faith in Action

At St. Mark's Presbyterian Church is our neighbour on Donway East and our featured church for this issue of the VOICE.

A number of members of our congregation have joined in special events at St. Mark's such as their Strawberry Social, Hot Dog/Corn Roasts, Valentine Tea, Christmas Holly Tea, Kiwanis Music Festival and church services. The Don Mills Men's Club, which some of our members attend, is held at St Mark's. Prior to meeting in The Donway Covenant United Church, the Summer Day Camp met at St. Mark's for several years.

St. Mark's Presbyterian Church is located at 1 Greenland Road (at the corner of The Donway East). The Rev. Daniel Cho, our Senior Minister, has just completed a year as Moderator for the national Presbyterian Church in Canada (from June 2018 to June 2019). The Rev. Erin Ko, our Associate Minister, serves our congregation half-time and also works

for Myung Sung Presbyterian Church which shares our building.

Every summer since the year 2000, St. Mark's has been an equal partner with DCUC and two other churches of The Donway, working to provide 8 weeks of fun Christian experiences for the children who attend FOOTPRINTS SUMMER DAY CAMP. The Leader-In-Training program and the employment of youth and young adults as staff members are of great benefit to our Don Mills community. During the rest of the year, our church is a hive of activity for children from Junior Kindergarten to Grade 6 on P.A. days (as designated by the TDSB). Upcoming dates for this KIDS' ZONE program are the following Fridays: October 11, November 15, and December 6, 2019. Advance registration is required.

We gather non-perishable foods for both The Community Share Food Bank (here in Don Mills, located at the Anglican Church of the Ascension) and for Evangel Hall (a Presbyterian-based service in downtown Toronto). For the latter, we also regularly provide fresh sandwich lunches, used clothing and toiletries. A favourite project of our church is ARISE Ministry (a mission of the Presbytery of East Toronto). Through its ongoing efforts, they provide outreach, case management and pastoral care to individuals involved in the sex-trade.

Weekly activities are taking place at St. Mark's: a women's quilting group, a local Men's Club, fitness classes, violin lessons offered through the SMiLe neighbourhood program (it historically originated in Flemingdon Park). There are evening activities held by the local Pathfinders/


Rangers group and the "Gavel and Glass" Toastmasters Club.

Bible studies occur throughout the year. In September, it was a women's study focusing on "Love in the New Testament." On Mondays, starting in October, Pastor Daniel will lead a study for everyone based on "Life of the Beloved: Spiritual Living in a Secular World," a book by Henri Nouwen. Sunday School is offered yearround for children and youth. Seasonal events feature an Advent Breakfast for families in advance of Advent's arrival, an annual Christmas pageant, Holy Week services and programs, and ongoing social gatherings. Where Do Worship Ideas Come From?

At our last Worship Committee Meeting, as we were discussing the theme for Advent this year ("dancing in the dark") the question was raised: Where do I get my worship ideas from? The short answer: God. A longer answer would be some ways I experience God in my life as a Christian person, and as a minister who tries to make God's presence known in our congregation, from week to week.


You know how tea is "steeped" in water so that water suffuses the tea leaves, and the water becomes suffused by the tea? I grew up like that, with God's Word, or presence, as a part of everything, suffusing me with a sense of God, steeping me in God's Word. Being aware of God is a blessing I carry with me which makes my life as a Christian person a basic piece of reality for me. The challenge is how to translate awareness in to faithful words, images, ideas, actions, worship, and activities that are meaningful for others. That's one of the challenges of being a minister. My role is not to entertain, nor be "successful" in a worldly way, not to be universally "liked", nor conform to conventional ideas in our culture about what the "good" is. We have many institutions which do that already, like the entertainment industry, businesses, and schools, etc. A minister's role is to interpret the gifts of scripture and Christian culture in ways which are faithful to the deep traditional knowledge of God revealed in Jesus. To do that, I look out in to our shared world through all the ways God has formed me as a person steeped in God's Word, and I seek cultural patterns (what the Bible calls "signs of the times") which speak to me of

God's Spirit. For instance, in the biblical symbol of "doors" and cultural yearnings to "transition", in the biblical symbol of "trees" and our anxiety about life surviviving, etc. I try to find ways to make deep connections between our religious faith, and our lives, so we can all grow in greater awareness and relationship with God.
