DCUC members contributed generously to the Fairlawn UC refugees program and it will be exciting to learn how it all turned out. On Sunday, June 3, we'll celebrate being an Affirming congregation, welcoming people of all sexual orientations, gender identies, races, etc.. June 10 will be the 93rd anniversary of the UCCan, and I'm really looking forward to hearing from Tom Joyce, Maureen Hall, and Carol and Rohan Gaghader, as they talk about "growing up UCCan". What was it like for different generations in the UCCan, and how has that changed? To celebrate First Nations Sunday on June 17, special guest Rev. Therese Samuel, will speak about our "treaty" relationships with First Nations peoples as "covenants" we have made. We are ALL "treaty people", because all of us are a party to these covenants made in our name as Canadians.

You may have heard that there are enormous changes coming to the United Church of Canada this Summer, with major restructuring, a new pastoral relations system, and general downsizing. After December 31, 2018, there will be no more presbyteries or Conferences, instead there will be large regional bodies, and a smaller national church. Faith in Action

An article of interest in the May issue of The United Church Observer, written by Wesley Brown, a longtime member of Stouffville United Church, and entitled "Stouffville Shines a Spotlight on Mental Health", describes how their church decided to host an evening considering teens and mental health. This interactive evening was presented by the church and with the local branch of the Canadian Mental Health Association. Wesley describes the meeting room as "packed with parents, mostly from the community." Many remained long after the meeting adjourned exchanging ideas in small groups. He continues by mentioning other programs which focus on resilience, seniors' mental health, the needs of caregivers and "making wellness a priority". He goes on to explain how this all came about: "a task force [was] charged with leading us into a period of renewal...[and] the congregation formally declared... [a] mission of creating community for all."

Tuesday Study Group Book Review

"What is the Bible?

How an Ancient Library of Poems, Letters, and Stories Can Transform the Way You Think and Feel About Everything."



The Tuesday Morning Study Group finished reading this book at the end of April, and it was one of our favourites! With his down-to-earth language and humorous style, Rob Bell captured our interest and caused us to think in new ways about what's in the Bible and how we can read it better to inspire us and gain meaning for our own lives and times. Although the book is not written in an academic style, the author writes with intelligence about the texts, their origins and what was happening in the world at the time. His love & joy for the Bible, which he says "is about what it means to be a human", are clear from beginning to end of the book. After 25 years of studying it, he finds the Bible "more compelling and mysterious and interesting and dangerous and convicting and helpful and strange and personal and inspiring and divine and enjoyable than ever". He writes with a refreshing style and uses questions, bold print and italics very effectively to keep you thinking and energized as you read. It's a book we'll reference again – the chapters are short & focused and stand on their own.

As someone commented online about this book "Who would have ever thought a book about the Bible could be this incredible? There isn't a soul alive that wouldn't be able to resonate with something in this book."

Rob Bell is a minister and New York Times bestselling author, and this book is now available in paperback. There is also a copy in the church library.


