A small family on the run from danger escapes across the seas, and on their way to safety witness the plight of endangered animals. A perfect blend of beautiful language and exquisite illustrations shows that with hope and courage none of us are so small that we cannot make a difference if we work together to save our world.



Big Box Little Box

Caryl Hart & Edward Underwood | PB \$12.99

Lots of boxes, one curious cat, and one sneaky mouse are the perfect combination in this clever story. The playful illustrations enhance the simple rhyming text, making this so much fun to read aloud. A great book to introduce colours, shapes, and sizes to toddlers beginning to learn these concepts. Be prepared to read this one over and over again!

Still Stuck

Shinsuke Yoshitake | HB \$17.99

Young children will delight in this laugh-out-loud story. Shown in simple cartoon style illustrations, a little boy tries to assert his independence by undressing himself but gets stuck with his shirt on his head. In his panic he imagines what life will be like if he remains stuck forever. Luckily his mother is there to help – until his next misadventure with tricky pyjamas!

This book is excellent for encouraging very young children to learn their colours, and Anna Walker's illustrations are an absolute joy.

The Bum Book


Kate Mayes and Andrew Joyner | HB \$19.99

Introduce the baby in your life to the sights and sounds of the world around them with these delightful cloth and board books. *Hello You, Hello Me* introduces the youngest babies to sun and fun and has a mirror too. *Toot, Toot, Boom!* is a fun way to learn about animals and instruments and it has a very handy off switch!



The Very Noisy Baby Alison Lester | HB \$24.99

A very noisy baby with a talent for making unusual sounds has the townsfolk convinced their missing creatures are in the little pink house on the edge of town. Alas, no, but this gives big sister a bright idea – can the noisy baby coax the animals out of hiding? Gorgeous illustrations accompany lively rhyming text with lots of growls, neighs and squawks to make story time lots of fun!

Kes Gray and Jim Field | HB \$24.99



Steve Antony | HB \$24.99



Guff

The slightly whacky illustrations in this simple, funny picture book perfectly capture a little girl's love for her special soft toy. Over the years, Guff has been abandoned on the bus, rescued (by mum) from a swimming pool, lost, found, washed and dried. He's missing an eye and an ear and is pretty ragged round the edges – evidence of having been almost literally loved to bits!



Grace and Katie

Grace and Katie are twins who love to draw but Grace loves everything to be neat and organised while Katie loves everything to be messy. When they decide to draw a map of their home and street the girls can't agree on how it should be done. They both decide to create their own and things do not go to plan. A beautiful story for all ages about sharing and caring and working together.



Danny Blue's Really Excellent Dream

Everything in Danny's world is blue, until the night he has a Really Excellent Dream about a whale that is NOT blue! Thrilled, he re-creates this colour, calls it RED, and unveils it to the townsfolk. Initially unpopular, it catches on and starts appearing everywhere, and then Danny dreams of a yellow fire engine.... A tale for older picture book readers about taking a risk and embracing the new.



After the Fall

Dan Santat | HB \$26.99

In the epilogue to the beloved classic nursery rhyme, Humpty Dumpty, while physically recovered, is afraid to get back up on his wall. But Humpty refuses to let his fear and anxiety stop him and with courage and determination he gets back up. This is a beautifully illustrated and inspirational book for children and adults about resilience and perseverance.



Charlie and Lola: A Dog with Nice Ears

"I have this little sister Lola. She is small and very funny." It's so great to have this brother and sister team back. This time Lola wants a dog but dad says ABSOLUTELY NO DOGS! but she can have a pet. As always, there's a twist in the tale, making this a fun read-aloud to share with fans old and new.

The Wolf, The Duck & The Mouse

Mac Barnett and Jon Klassen | HB \$24.99

This hilarious story, accompanied by Jon Klassen's wonderful retro illustrations, follows the escapades of wolf, a gastronomic duck and a fearful mouse. Adults and youngsters alike will love discovering the reason for wolf's howl. A joyous romp, destined to become a firm favourite for bedtime reading.

Izzy Gizmo

Pip Jones and Sara Ogilvie | HB \$24.99

Izzy Gizmo's inventions are weirdly wonderful but don't always work. When Izzy rescues an injured crow with wings that are too broken to repair, she sets out to make a set of wings so her new friend can fly. The bright illustrations and rhyming text are a perfect match for this fantastically feisty character who doesn't give up.


Florence Frizzball

When I Grow Up is everything you'd expect from the genius of Tim Minchin, with a touch of inspiration from Roald Dahl: playful, silly and heart-filled. It's a rhythmic, joyous ride about a wish to be able to go to bed late, watch cartoons forever, and eat lollies at all times. Ultimately it's about the joy of freedom that both kids and grown-ups will identify with. Includes a digital download of the song.




Pig the Star



John Lennon and Jean Jullien | HB \$24.99



Corinne Fenton & Robin Cowcher | HB \$24.99




Beatrice 7inker, [pside Down Thinker] Shelley Johannes | PB \$12.99





A darkly magical book (which is only a little scary) recommended for readers 8+.



Swimming on the Lawn

Yasmin Hamid | PB \$16.99

Set in Sudan in the 1960s, you are gently drawn in to the childhood of Farida and her siblings. Making pots of tea and helping to prepare delicious breakfasts, cooling yourself under the shady trees and building blanket forts in the back garden. All the small details of the everyday immerses the reader in Farida's world. The author drops unsettling hints at the future along the way but leaves it up to the reader to speculate what happens to her father. Readers will enjoy comparing and contrasting their childhood experiences and learning about Sudanese culture. Recommended for ages 10+



Birthday Boy

Sam Green really really loves his birthday. He loves his birthday so much that on his 11th birthday he makes a wish on a shooting star that it could be his birthday every day. He soon discovers that this could actually be quite disastrous. A hilarious roller coaster of a read.






Kid Normal

All's Faire in Middle School


Victoria Jamieson | PB \$19.99

Greta Zargo and the Death Robots From Outer Space A.F. Harrold and Joe Todd-Stanton | PB \$12.99

Orphaned as a baby, 11-year-old Greta came into her inheritance aged 8 (due to a spelling mistake), and is loosely supervised by Aunt Tabitha. With aspirations to win the local medal for journalism in Upper Lowerbridge, Greta thinks she's found her Big Scoop and is on the trail of a cake thief. Meanwhile, aliens have landed in town and are keen to take over earth. Full of asides (literally, scribbled on the sides of the pages) and interruptions from a hovering silvery robot, this is a whacky read!



The Shop at Hoopers Bend Emily Rodda | PB \$16.99

A string of coincidences and uncharacteristically rash decisions bring 11-year-old orphan Quil and recently-retired Bailey together at Hoopers Bend. While Bailey recovers from a minor injury, they fall easily into a companionable routine, hatching plans to revive the old shop. As the layers of the past are peeled back, Quil understands why she feels so at home here. This warm, magical novel is a charming read – I really loved it!

Cath Crowley, Simmone Howell, Fiona Woods | PB \$18.99


