- Connecticut ranks high in congestion among 297 US cities examined*



- Between 1990 and 2015, GHG emissions in transportation sector increased more in absolute terms than in any other sector (USEPA)
- For the first time since 1970s, US CO₂ emissions from transportation eclipsed electricity generation as top source of GHG emissions. (USEIA)

¹ The average driving costs per driver are made up of direct (purchase, maintenance, fuel, insurance, parking, tolls and taxes) and indirect (wasted time, fuel and carbon emission from congestion and searching for parking, parking fines and parking overpayments) costs.

INRIX Cost of Driving Study calculated vehicle ownership costs for 30 major cities in the U.S., U.K., and Germany. Leveraging INRIX global data, the study found that traffic and parking-related costs made up nearly half of the total cost of car ownership in the U.S.

The hidden, indirect costs of driving – like sitting in congestion and searching for parking – represented about a third of the total cost of vehicle ownership in the U.S.




\$1,394 in 2017 Hidden Parking Costs




