It's almost time to get out there and get going again. The equipment repairs are about completed, and we're starting to get some material hauled to various locations.

The plan for this spring for Wally's group is to finish up work on I-80 at Hershey and Stapleton North, then move out to the Kimball area for 3 projects, about 85,000 tons in all.

Ron and company will be starting some of the Department of Roads new 1" overlays in the Cambridge/Wilsonville area, before going up to Rose for an overlay project. It has not yet been determined which crew will go where after that.

Our subcontractors either have started working, or will be shortly, at Sargent South, Arnold East, Hamlet to Palisade, Farnam West and N-21 to Elwood.

As you can see, it is shaping up to be a busy year. Hopefully the weather will cooperate.

As of Monday, March 9th, Gothenburg is running. Cozad, Lexington, North Platte (Beer Creek) and Gates are within a day or so. The remainder of the pits are getting close.

The Building Department continues to move forward on several projects as we make our way through the winter season.

The final items have been completed on the Lexington Middle School/ Orthman Community YMCA. Project Superintendent Terry Brand has been coordinating the completion of all the "punch list" items necessary to bring the project to final completion.

In Ogallala, Project Superintendent Shane Schutte and crew has the Ogallala Elementary / Middle School fully "open for business" as of March 9, 2015. This project is now also in the "punch list" portion correcting any minor issues that need to be done before the official and final completion.

Project Superintendent Dan Schwarz and crew have been inside the Gothenburg State Bank in Gothenburg renovating the main teller lines, adding offices, and many other misc. improvements inside the bank.

Project Superintendent Clay Otto and crew have been jumping around doing work as the weather has allowed over the last couple of months. This crew has gotten a taste of a lot of different phases of the building construction process over the winter months. Clay and crew will be back at Cubby's in Gothenburg completing paving at the truck stop. From there, we have multiple projects lined up for the spring season.

Superintendent Dan Niles and crew have been in Gothenburg

working on a classroom addition at Gothenburg Schools. This classroom will be complete and ready for occupancy by the middle of March.

Construction of a new office building for Hi Gain Feedlot is nearing completion in Gothenburg thanks to Project Foreman Ross Collins and crew. Floor covering will be installed around the middle of March and the remaining interior work should be wrapped up within a few weeks after that. Some exterior concrete work remains as soon as spring gets here, and the building should then be ready for occupancy.

Construction continues on the renovations to the Majestic Theater in downtown Lexington. Project Foreman Victor Lopez and crew have been renovating this historic building. Interior painting will be completed by the end of March, with the remaining interior finishes to proceed during the month of April.

Work will begin on interior renovations at First Bank and Trust in Cozad in late March. The interior of the main area of the bank will be renovated while at the same time keeping the bank in business.

Design work continues on the \$4.5 million expansion and renovation for Sumner Eddyville Miller School in Sumner. On site construction work will begin in June, 2015

Design is also in progress for the expansion and renovation to Lexington High School. This will include an addition on the west side of the current facility. On site construction work will begin in June, 2015.

Ready Mix

It is starting to feel a lot like Spring!! I think it is safe to say that we are all ready for the 2015 construction season to begin. It always seems like a long time from Christmas to Spring.

The Ready Mix division spent another winter in Broken Bow tearing down an old plant again this year. This time it wasn't ours for very long. Last Fall Broken Bow Ready Mix contacted us about selling their business to us, a month or so later Larry Paulsen decided to purchase the business. We kept some of the equipment, sold some of the equipment, and moved the rest off site.

About the time that was done we entered into an agreement to purchase the Franklin Ready Mix from the Plank family. We have since been busy upgrading this plant to be ready for the NDOR project that is just West of Franklin. We have hired Doug Walton as our plant manager in Franklin, and are currently looking for a couple truck drivers to help us out. A couple of our other Winter projects have been to polish the showroom floor in Holdrege, along with new concrete countertops for the batch area, and to add an addition to the Lexington plant for a gravel office and display space for some of Nate's construction products.

We have a lot of concrete to deliver this year on a bunch of different jobs. Every plant we have has some nice work lined up for the year. I will touch on just a few of the major jobs. Franklin to Bloomfield NDOR project, 3 paving jobs in Holdrege, large grain facility and a new Casey's in Arapahoe, 2 paving jobs and 3 large building projects in Lexington, County white-topping job for Cozad, a large city paving job and 2 large building jobs in Broken Bow, 3 paving jobs in Gothenburg, a paving job and a bridge in North Platte, and 3 patching jobs and one interstate bridge in Ogallala, along with 3 airports and a feedlot for the two portables.



Black, Joe and Don will be finishing up on the Norfolk State project,

getting some temporary paving done in Genoa, and then paving at the Phillipsburg Airport runway project. From there we will move to the Cambridge Airport runway and back to pave in Genoa.

Darrell and Sam will finish the Ogallala city project, and the North Platte Birdwood job with SEMA, and then to Holdrege where we have two projects, one on 11th Avenue and the other on Highway 6 East.

Denny and Glen have a little bit of Johnson Lake Trail to complete, paving Liberty Drive in Lexington, paving in Arapahoe, two jobs in Gothenburg, and possibly the Imperial Airport apron and taxiways.

We want to welcome Justin Morrow and Steve Buss who will be heading up another crew this year. Justin and Steve were with Constructors and prior to that with Dobson Bros. Construction. They will probably start in Holdrege and then move to Grand Island on the Capital Avenue project.

Gary and Nick have been surveying at Genoa, and will be doing the survey at Phillipsburg and Cambridge for the grading and the stringless paving. They will also be staking the Imperial Airport, along with the Darr Bridge white-top and the Gothenburg viaduct.

We will also have an 8-mile white-topping project at Darr Bridge Road and the Gothenburg viaduct to complete this year along with some more trail at Johnson Lake.

And, as everyone knows, all of the schedules are subject to change. We want to stress to everyone to work safely and efficiently.

McSafety's Corner

We have made it through our annual safety training and I would like to thank everyone for their attention and participation. I would like to thank LP for taking the time to prepare the food for the meetings this year and all the great steak we devoured.

I would also like to thank Scott Holbrook and Carlos Avalos for all the work they did in helping with the meetings. Our goal is always to provide you with the training and information you need to work safely and to help you keep your workplace as safe as possible.

We all need to put an increased emphasis on following procedures, performing required inspections, ensuring everyone is properly trained and that everyone is performing their work in a safe manner. We need to make sure that no one operates any equipment that they haven't been properly trained on, their performance evaluated that they can operate it safely and that their training is properly documented. OSHA and MSHA have made this one of their highest priorities.

We also need to improve in wearing the proper Personal Protective Equipment for the task being performed and then cleaning it and storing it properly. We continue to find PPE that is either unsanitary or has not been stored properly or both. We have found PPE that has been neglected to the point that it is damaged and must be replaced, some of which is extremely expensive.

We must inspect everything prior to use and to inspect it monthly and record it in writing. These inspections need to be performed on everything we work with along with our trucks and our heavy equipment.

Remember to STOP before you do something, LOOK at what you are about to do for hazards, ANALYZE what could go wrong if I do this and then MANAGE the problem. Figure out your course of action by either eliminating the hazard, controlling the hazard, or protecting yourself from the hazard.

We have completed a couple of years now with a much improved safety record with very few accidents and injuries. We all need to continue to work towards not just maintaining that level but to improve on it.

Warmer Weather is on the Way!

For those of you that will be returning from winter lay-off and preparing to start the new season, please remember your body is not used to working the long rigorous hours that will soon be required. Most muscle injuries can be prevented by simply taking time before you start your day to stretch and warm up those muscles!

As always, being safe just "doesn't happen". You have to be intentional every day to watch yourself and those around you and perform all tasks as required.

If something is too heavy to lift on your own, get help. If it's too big with help and you have equipment available to assist, then use the equipment! Make sure when climbing in and out of your trucks that you are entering and exiting properly. Sometimes taking the extra few seconds to do a job, may save you from having an injury or accident.

Working together and working as safe as possible has been a major factor in keeping the injury/accidents down over the past 3 years. Continue to report all injury/accidents as soon as possible. Doing so allows me the opportunity to assist with the case as it moves forward, which aids in keeping all costs down.
