Johnson Dairy

A piece of Commerce City history is going away. The Johnson Farm Dairy land, located at 5201 East 56th Ave., has been sold to Old Dominion Trucking Company. In September demolition will begin, and all of the current buildings are going to be demolished. The CCHS spent the day on June 30 filming and taking pictures with the family to record this piece of

The I.X.L. Dairy...5201 East 56th Avenue

John Johnson was born in Copenhagen, Denmark on December 8, 1864. He immigrated to America in 1882. Hattie Johnson was born in Sweden on January 18, 1867. She immigrated to America in 1887. She met John Johnson at a Swedish picnic. They were married in 1900 and built their home on what is now 56th Avenue in Commerce City. John operated a dairy farm. At first he was in partnership with his brother-in-law, Mr. Lindvall and then later he operated his own dairy. They had one daughter Lillie. John passed away in 1917 in an accident in Henderson picking up hay. His horses were spooked and he was run over by a hay mower. After John's death Hattie worked hard to keep the farm. She passed away September 28, 1944.

Axel and Lillie Johnson owned and operated the I.X.L. Dairy from 1924 to 1954 which they purchased from Ida and Victor Danielson (I.X.L.Danielson Dairy). Axel and Lillie built a home next to John and Hattie (5171 East 56th Avenue). They had three

children (Robert, Ann and Jerry). All graduated from Adams City High School. Robert has 2 sons (Bruce and Stuart), Ann has 3 daughters (Julie, Loraine, and Karen) and Jerry has 1 daughter (Cara).


Lillie died young at the age of 60 on December 27, 1963 following an operation. Axel Johnson lived to the age of 82 passing away in May of 1972. Robert, the eldest son passed away in 2014. Jerry and Ann are still living. Jerry lives in Denver and Ann lives in Commerce City and are both members of the Commerce City Historical Society.


preceded in death by her parents, Joe Martel and Josephine Ortiz, 1 brother, 1 sister, 2 grandchildren and 1 great-grandson.






