#### Jenna Son

Jenna Son, age 11, is a 6th grader at the Robert E. Willett Elementary School in Davis, CA. She began studying violin with Ms. Heather Powell at the age of 6, and currently studies with Dr. Christine Choi. She also had private lessons with Mr. Jeremy Preston and chamber music lessons with Ms. Susan Lamb Cook. She has played with Sacramento Youth Symphony for 4 years and was the concertmaster in the Vivace Strings directed by Mr. Greg Brucker and Academic Strings Orchestra directed by Mr. Angelo Moreno. Jenna enjoys the school orchestra program taught by Ms. Sherie Wall, and she is the concertmaster of the Davis All-City Elementary Orchestra conducted by Ms. Lydia Cooley. Besides violin, Jenna began piano lessons with Ms. I-Hui Chen at the age of 4 and currently studies with Ms. Akiko Gaffney. She was a first place winner in the Crescendo International Music Competition with violin. As a pianist, she won top prizes in the CAPMT Go For The Gold Music Competition, Classical Masters Music Festival, and JPTAG piano competition. Jenna also plays chamber music. She has participated in the Winter Chamber Music Program directed by Ms. Susan Lamb Cook in 2019–2020. As part of the program, she played music in some senior residences. Her string quartet performed in the "Rising Stars of Chamber Music" concert in 2020. Outside of music, Jenna enjoys reading, writing, sewing, and playing tennis with her dad.

#### Sarah Son

Sarah Son, age 13, is an 8<sup>th</sup> grader at Oliver Wendell Holmes Junior High School in Davis, CA. She began violin lessons with Ms. Heather Powell at the age of 5, and currently studies with Dr. Christine Choi. She played with the Sacramento Youth Symphony for 6 years and is a first violinist in the Premier Orchestra directed by Michael Neumann since 2017. She has won awards and scholarships in the CAPMT Go For The Gold Music Competition, Classical Masters Music Festival, Crescendo International Music Competition and Auburn Symphony Young Artists Competition. She was a semifinalist for the SYS Premier Concerto Competition in 2018 and 2019. Sarah

has been the concertmaster of the SYS Classic Orchestra, Davis All-City Elementary Orchestra, Holmes Junior High School Intermediate Orchestra, and UOP Junior Camp String Orchestra. She has been selected to go to CASMEC Junior High All-State Honors Orchestra as a first violin in 2019 and 2020. As an avid chamber musician, she has participated in the Winter Chamber Music Program directed by Ms. Susan Lamb Cook since 2016. As a part of the program, she enjoyed playing in senior residences. Her trio won the first place in MTAC VOCE branch competition in 2017 and 2020. She performed in the "Rising Stars of Chamber Music" concerts in 2018, 2019, and 2020. Besides violin, she began studying piano with Ms. Christy Kimball at the age of 4, and currently studies with Ms. Akiko Gaffney. In her spare time, Sarah loves drawing bunnies, making origami, and hanging out with her friends and little sister.

#### Calvin Yeh

Born in Los Angeles, California, Calvin Yeh is a cellist who's been learning since the age of 8. Anne also studied professional stage performance with Ed Hooks (San Francisco). Anne applied her formal training for teaching music for the Los Angeles Unified School District. Due to the success of our virtual Spring Recital and with continued in person social distancing, the upcoming Sacramento Section Fall Showcase recital will once again be in an online format. Everyone is welcome to participate. We encourage performers of all ages and ability levels. Participating instruments include violin, viola, cello, string bass, harp and guitar. Your music instructor must be a member of ASTA. Performers will need to create a YouTube account and create a video on YouTube. Please read the following information to participate.

- **\*** The deadline for the application form is Monday, November 2 (postmark). See application form for details.
- **❖** The deadline for emailing the link to the online video uploaded to YouTube (unlisted or listed) to the Sacramento ASTA President at <a href="kcolefeeney@gmail.com">kcolefeeney@gmail.com</a> is Friday, November 13 at 11:59 pm. Please see below for details and instructions.
- ❖ The recital program with the link to each performance will be emailed to all recital participants and Sacramento Section ASTA members on Sunday, November 15th at 2pm. Please also be sure to provide the participating teachers and students email addresses on the recital application.

Checks must be mailed separately if using the online application.

### Video submission guidelines

- 1) Dress should be formal. Music does not need to be memorized, but it is encouraged with the exception of sonatas and chamber music.
- 2) The video recording must be made with one fixed camera angle, focused on the performer(s) with face and hands of performer visible at about 6ft-8ft away from the camera. Their entire body should be clearly visible on the screen throughout the performance.
- 3) The video recording must be unaltered and unedited.
- 4) The participant must appear dressed in video as they would in a live recital.
- 5) Check video for sound and visual quality before uploading.
- 6) Send the student's name and a link to their YouTube upload (unlisted or listed) to the Sacramento President via email at kcolefeeney@gmail.com. This email with student's name and video link address is due Friday November 13 at 11:59pm. Please be sure to receive a confirmation email or try again.
