

SANTA CLARA FIRE DISTRICT

RESIDENTIAL BURN PERMIT

Residential burning is allowed only on approved burning days, from October 15 - June 15.

Open burning in Lane County is governed by rules and regulation of the Lane Regional Air Protection Agency and local Fire Districts.

THE BURNING OF YARD DEBRIS IS LIMITED TO THE WOODY YARD TRIMMINGS FROM TREES AND SHRUBS GROWING UPON THE SAME PREMISES WHERE THE BURNING OCCURS.

Materials **NOT ALLOWED** to be burned are such things as leaves, grass clippings, tires, oil, tarpaper, large branches or tree stumps, garbage, insulation, and construction, demolition or industrial waste or any material that creates dense smoke or noxious odors.

REQUIREMENTS:

- ✓ The property upon which burning is to take place must be a private lot of at least one-half acre in size if located within the Eugene Urban Growth Area.
- ✓ Burning is allowed only on approved burning days.
- ✓ Burning is allowed during DAYLIGHT HOURS ONLY and shall be completely extinguished by dark. (EXCEPTION: Burning after daylight may be permitted with written permission by the Fire Chief.)
- ✓ The fire shall be attended at all times.
- ✓ The material to be burned shall be dry.
- ✓ The burn pile shall not exceed three cubic yards at any time.
- ✓ A small hot fire should be maintained and fed continuously with small quantities of fuel.
- ✓ Burning under the authority of this permit shall not create a public nuisance or a hazard to public safety.
- ✓ Tools for extinguishing the fire shall be readily available.
- ✓ This permit shall be available for inspection any time burning is being conducted.

Before burning call 726-3976 for the Daily Burning Advisory.

Violations of these requirements are subject to civil penalties from the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality.

If your fire gets out of control, call 9-1-1 immediately.
