#### MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF

## THE CITY OF HOMEWOOD, ALABAMA

## October 12, 2020

The City Council of the City of Homewood, Alabama convened in Regular Session on Monday, October 12, 2020 at City Hall at 6:00 p.m.

The invocation was given by Councilor Barry Smith, after which the pledge of allegiance was given.

The meeting was called to order by President Wright at 6:25 p.m.

Upon Roll Call, the following were present: Andy Gwaltney, Britt Thames, Mike Higginbotham, Andrew Wolverton, Patrick McClusky, Walter Jones, Barry Smith, Alex Wyatt, Jennifer Andress, John Hardin, and Peter Wright and constituting a quorum of Council members. President Wright stated that the reading of the Minutes from the September 28, 2020 Council Meeting would be carried over.

President Wright stated that the application period for the Park Board At-Large position would be opened until October 19, 2020 at 4:30 p.m.
