#### Maths Week 2020

Maths Week is a special time to enjoy mathematics in a variety of contexts and to engage in a series of lessons that promote creativity, investigation and curiosity. The highlight of our week was a visit from 'Major Tom', a mathematically minded spaceman! The children were entertained by his fun assemblies and challenging workshops.



Amongst many other class activities, here are some more highlights:

- Butterflies have been exploring number lines using a Beebot robot.
- Pre Prep have been making pictures out of shapes, inspired by Matisse's 'The Snail' and investigating how many things they can put in boxes.
- Prep 1 made some wonderful 'modern art' with repeating patterns and have investigated money.
- Prep 2 made delicious looking pizzas to help them understand fractions.
- Prep 3 created bar charts about online communication and have investigated hand and feet sizes.
- Prep 4 planned a budget for a camping trip and have started making artwork of symmetrical insects.
- Prep 5 created colour charts using proportions and have been making straight lines out of curves.
- Prep 6 produced fantastic polygon tessellation artwork and have investigated fractions.

Each class has also thought of lots of different ways to make the number 12 – please see the display outside the hall for a great range of inventive and interesting ways.
