### From the Principal

### Dear families.

It's been great to have the aviation students here again as they are every term in weeks 4 and 5. The weather has been very good, and we do appreciate their time with us.

We have students who have joined us from places like Mt Gambier, Maitland, Gawler, Mt Barker, Clare, and the Adelaide plains; as well as 11 who are local – our highest ever intake of MNCC students to the course.

The Aviation program is funded generously from the Sir Ross and Sir Keith Smith Fund, which every year makes the running of this course viable.

Today you will notice I have included another flow chart. I like these because they are visual, and provide a good way of showing clearly what possibilities and outcomes are possible depending on choices. Sometimes I wish we had some good clear flow charts for life. Well, actually I think we can draw them up if we give it a little thought. If we work hard, treat people well, be honest and kind etc., we can project with reasonable confidence how life could well unfold.

This particular flowchart is for handling Student Grievance. It is colour coded to help students think about what is likely to happen if they have a problem that needs solving. Like us, they may initially have an 'Escape' reaction or an 'Attack' reaction. Both of these are emotional responses, but as you can see do not generally lead to good outcomes. In fact they do not solve the problem at all.

We have been called to assist in some recent situations where students have responded to problems by taking to various social media with a 'gossip' and 'put down' set of approaches. This rarely ends well, and usually makes things worse. We believe this flowchart will be useful to discuss healthier, and more restorative ways of dealing with differences and offendedness.

If we see conflict as an opportunity for growth, it is much healthier than seeing it as inflammatory.

We are still developing the wording of the revised grievance policy, but you can see


