PREAMBLE

This document clearly states the responsibilities of parents and school relating to the medical care (planned or accidental) for pupils at Pecanwood College. Please read through thoroughly and complete and return the **Authorisation to Administer Medication** and the **Medical Questionnaire**. It is your responsibility to notify the Onsite medical officer of all medication brought onto campus. The Medical Questionnaire will ensure the correct and appropriate care will be provided to your son and/or daughter.

General Practice

If a *learner* is ill at home on the morning of a school day or has been ill at home over the weekend and not fully recovered by Monday morning, *please do not bring the Learner to school*. This is done as to prevent the infection of other *learners* at Pecanwood College.

DAY LEARNERS

- In the case of minor to moderate medical conditions such as headaches, flu, nausea, vomiting ext. learners will be referred by a Pecanwood College staff member to the San Clinic for a medical assessment by the onsite medical officer.
- It is the responsibility of a Pecanwood College staff member to contact the onsite medical officer and inform him of the learner as the San Clinic is not open all day (please see sanatorium hours).
- If after the medical assessment by the onsite medical officer it is deemed necessary for further medical intervention, the onsite medical officer will contact the Pecanwood College staff member and parents of the day learner as to discuss possible treatment and give feedback on medical assessment.
- All learners residing within the boarding facilities will follow the same medical protocol should they become ill during the school day.

BOARDERS RESIDING WITHIN PECANWOOD COLLEGE SCHOOL HOSTELS

- The onsite medical officer will be contacted by the Pecanwood College hostel staff member on call informing him of the *learner* and medical assistance needed.
- The *learner* must be accompanied by the Pecanwood College hostel staff member on call to the San Clinic as to ensure all relevant information is shared and treatment options discussed.
- The onsite medical officer will conduct a medical assessment as to establish the extent of medical assistance needed.
- The Pecanwood Collage hostel staff member on call must be informed of the medication prescribed / needed by the learner as to ensure the learner will be correctly monitored once back at the hostel.
- Should it be found that the *learner* is in need of additional medical intervention by the
 designated medical practitioner / hospitalization, the onsite medical officer will revert back to
 the protocol regarding contact with parents, Pecanwood College hostel staff members on
 call, arrangements for transport and appointments booked with medical practitioner.
- Should an independent Ambulance services be needed for transfer the learner to hospital, the
 onsite medical officer will be responsible for all transport and administrative requirements with
 the independent Ambulance service/ parents of the learner and Pecanwood College hostel
 staff members on call.
- The onsite medical officer will be present with the hand-over of learner to independent ambulance service for transport.
- The onsite medical officer will ensure all relevant medical information is available at the medical
 practitioner when appointment is booked. The parents of the learner will also be notified by the
 onsite medical officer on any additional cost and or co-payments needed.
- The Pecanwood College hostel staff member on call will accompany/transport the learner to the medical practitioner.
- The Pecanwood College hostel staff member on call will also be responsible to ensure the safe return of the learner concerned and report to the onsite medical officer if any follow up work/appointment is necessary.

Please note that:

- Prescription Medications will be obtained from MOUNTAIN LAKE Pharmacy.
- It is strongly recommended that parents should at all times ensure efficient funds are available
 to all learners as to cover any medical expenses incurred at the designated medical practitioner
 or pharmacy.
- Memberships of Medical Aids outside the borders of South Africa are not always accepted by Doctors' Rooms/ pharmacy or Hospitals, therefore these costs will be charged to the accounts of those parents.
- It is the parent's responsibility to submit these accounts to their Medical Aids for payment.
- Dermatology and Orthodontic services will not be provided by Pecanwood College.
- Parents / learners should schedule all appointments during school holidays or mid-term breaks.
 Should a learner need an urgent follow up appointment, designated drivers and vehicles will be made available by Pecanwood College, the costs for these services will be for the parents' account.
- All urgent follow up appointments should be arranged with sufficient prior notice as to allow Pecanwood College hostel staff members on call adequate time to arrange transport and supervision.
- In the case of distance boarders who need routine medical attention, parents are advised to make contact with the onsite medical officer as to assist and facilitate appointments and transport arrangements.
- Medical practitioners in close proximity to Pecanwood College will be utilized for practical reasons.

VERY IMPORTANT

Any medication sent to the Pecanwood College Hostel to be used by the learner, must be handed to the medical officer. No learner will be allowed to have any medication with them in their rooms. Should it be suspected that a learner has any medication in the room, they will be subjected to a search.

The onsite medical officer will contact the parents of the learner via telephone or email as to notify them if a new medication script is needed. Notification will be done two weeks in advance.

SANATORIUM HOURS

Morning sessions: 06h30 - 08h00

Hostel learners receiving any medication are to report to the San Clinic as to receive medication from the onsite medical officer.

Afternoon sessions: 17h00 - 18h00

Hostel learners receiving any medication are to report to the San Clinic as to receive medication from the onsite medical officer.

Weekends

The Pecanwood College hostel staff member on call must contact the onsite medical officer during the weekend should any learner need medical assistance.

The onsite medical officer may be contact on the following number should his assistance be needed outside the listed sanatorium hours; **083 638 4669**. Please note this number may only be used by Pecanwood College staff members, Pecanwood College hostel staff members and parents of learners. The listed number is not for use of the learners themselves to arrange for medical assistance directly with the onsite medical officer.

MEDICAL AIDS

Medical aids outside the boarders of South Africa are not always accepted at Doctors room or Hospitals. We recommend parents to get a South African medical aid that will cover costs such as:

- Doctors consultations
- X-rays
- MRI or CT Scans
- Blood tests
- Hospital admissions
- A savings option for day to day medication

URGENT MEDICAL ASSISTANCE NEEDED AT THE COLLEGE (DAY LEARNERS AND BOARDERS)

- The onsite medical officer will be contacted by a Pecanwood College staff member informing him of the learner and medical assistance needed.
- The onsite medical officer will conduct a medical assessment as to establish the extent of medical assistance needed.
- The onsite medical officer will after discussing the medical intervention needed with the parent of the learner / Pecanwood College staff member, phone for an appointment at the designated medical practitioner as identified within close proximity of Pecanwood College.
- Please note, all medical treatment needed outside of Pecanwood College, will be booked in close proximity to Pecanwood College, except in cases where specialized medical intervention is needed except hospitalization.
- The onsite medical officer will ensure all relevant medical information is available at the medical
 practitioner when appointment is booked. The parents of the learner will also be notified by the
 onsite medical officer on any additional cost and or co-payments needed.
- A Pecanwood College staff member will accompany/transport the learner to the medical practitioner at set time of appointment.
- In the case of a Day Learner the parents of the learner will be responsible for transfer to medical practitioner unless alternative arrangements are made.
- The designated Pecanwood Collage staff member will also be responsible to ensure the safe return of the learner concerned to Pecanwood College, and report to the onsite medical officer if any follow up work/appointment is necessary.
- Should an independent Ambulance services be needed for transfer to hospital, The onsite
 medical officer will be responsible for all transport and administrative requirements with the
 independent Ambulance service/ parents of the learner and Pecanwood College staff
 members.
- The onsite medical officer will be present with the hand-over of learner to independent ambulance service for transport.

Please note that:

- **Hospitalization/transfer costs** must be claimed from Medical Aids by the parents of the learner themselves.
- Where no Medical Aid is in place, Pecanwood College and the onsite medical officer will need
 an affidavit to the effect stating that the parents take full responsibility for any outstanding
 medical costs incurred by the learner.
- All parents will be contacted by the onsite medical officer prior to any hospitalization / transport arrangements are made and finalized as to ensure no unexpected medical costs to be incurred.
- It will be the responsibility of the parent of the learner to ensure transport is arranged from the admitting hospital back to Pecanwood College post discharge.

• Comprehensive feedback regarding medical aftercare must be discussed with the onsite medical officer / Pecanwood College Hostel on call staff member as to ensure ongoing medical intervention is maintained when needed.

SPORT MEDICAL PROTOCOL

The sports department within Pecanwood College will communicate directly with parents as to the specific requirements of each sport as to ensure claims are not refused. This applies to gum guards, protective helmets etc.

Pecanwood College would like to draw the parent's attention to the medical protocols on **Match** days.

As to ensure Pecanwood College complies with S.A Rugby's (Boksmart) mandated requirements, and the safety of all Pecanwood learners, Pecanwood College undertakes the following;

- A Medical post will be erected next to the sports fields during match days.
- The onsite medical officer will facilitate all additional medical personnel if needed.
- The onsite medical officer will inform the local independent Ambulance service of the match day and ensure they will be on standby should any learner need transport due to injury.
- Life Fourways Hospital will be used as designated service provider for all learners transferred by ambulance.
- The San Clinic will be available at all home fixtures.
- When playing away, Pecanwood College Sports Department will contact the medical personnel at the host school as to ensure that similar protocols will be in place.
- **Please note** that no match will commence unless Pecanwood College is satisfied that the appropriate safety procedure are in place.

Parents of both rugby and hockey players are reminded that all learners must wear gum guard/helmets when playing. These have been made available to all learners at the Clothing Shop at Pecanwood College. Gum guards/helmets are vital in protecting the jaw and teeth against injury/damage due to the high impact nature of the sport. The sports insurance policy will not cover any injuries sustained to the learner's mouth if a gum guard was not worn at the time of the injury. Gum guards are thus compulsory equipment. Coaches will not allow any learner to participate in the game without the appropriate safety gear.

CONDUCTING OF RANDOM DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

This will be conducted in accordance with the **Substance Abuse Policy** of Pecanwood College.
