Final Gremation Options

Perhaps the most fundamental and personal decision when choosing cremation is finding a final disposition or resting place for your loved one's cremated remains. Cremation offers a number of options for final placement, each involving considerations from cost through the impact on future generations. Here are some of your options for a final resting place:

- **Burial** Burying an urn in a cemetery remains a popular choice for families. It provides a permanent resting place and lasting memorial for generations of families and friends to freely visit and cherish memories.
- Columbarium Niche An aboveground structure protected by glass, marble, granite or bronze, a columbarium niche also provides a permanent remembrance and central location where family and friends can visit and pay their respects.
- Home Placement Some families choose to display or keep the urn in a private or prominent place in their home. The closeness can be comforting for family members, and is an option for those who may consider relocating in the future.
- **Scattering** Scattering the cremated remains in a special place is a choice that is significant but permanent. Some families may choose to scatter only a portion of the cremated remains and keep the rest as a more permanent keepsake.
- Keepsake and Jewellery There are many choices of memorial keepsakes and jewellery
 that hold small portions of cremated remains, providing multiple family members with
 individual mementos to treasure or allowing for placement of the cremated remains in
 various settings.



Local Gemetery Options

Greenwood Cemetery, Burlington (905-335-7765)

Located at 1030 Greenwood Drive (off Francis Road) in Burlington, Greenwood Cemetery offers cremation burial lots and columbarium niches as special places to remember and commemorate the life of a loved one. Operated by the City of Burlington, a recent expansion to the cemetery includes more interment plots, new columbarium structures and more landscaping.

Holy Sepulchre Catholic Cemetery, Burlington (905-522-7727)

The Diocese's best known cemetery, Holy Sepulchre on Plains Road in Burlington is the resting place of many of the Diocese's bishops, priests and religious sisters. Outdoor columbarium space is available for cremated remains, as are crypts and indoor niches at both Our Lady of Victory Mausoleum and Holy Souls Mausoleum. The mausolea are located within Holy Sepulchre.

Gate of Heaven Catholic Cemetery, Burlington/Hamilton (905-522-7727)

Any season is beautiful at this cemetery on Old York Road, a Burlington address near the border of Hamilton. Gate of Heaven Catholic Cemetery offers cremation burial lots and an outdoor columbarium for cremated remains. Our Lady of Peace Mausoleum (located within the cemetery) has both crypt and niche spaces available.

Woodland Cemetery, Burlington/Hamilton (905-546-4704)

Located near the Royal Botanical Gardens at 700 Spring Gardens Road, Woodland Cemetery provides a peaceful setting and offers both cremation urn garden burial lots and columbarium niches. Operated by the City of Hamilton, the cemetery sits on a scenic and historic parcel of land facing Hamilton Harbour.

*Evergreen Cemetery, Milton (905-875-1404)

Located at 190 Ontario Street in Milton, Evergreen Cemetery is a 26-acre plot of land that provides a parklike setting with burial and columbarium niche options, as well as a scattering garden for your loved one's cremated remains.

*Trafalgar Lawn Cemetery, Oakville (905-338-4236)

Located at 1149 Dundas Street West in Oakville, Trafalgar Lawn Cemetery offers 30 acres of peaceful, forested greenspace overlooking Sixteen Mile Creek. The cemetery has urn burial lots, columbarium niches, a scattering garden and also offers pond scattering for the final disposition of your loved one's cremated remains.
