

The regular meeting of The Burk's Falls Council was held on Tuesday, September 22, 2020 at the Community Centre at 4:30 pm.

### **MINUTES**

Resolution 2020-136 Moved by Jarvis Osborne - Seconded by Lisa Morrison That the Council for the Village of Burk's Falls hereby approves the minutes of the regular Council meeting of August 25, 2020 as circulated. Carried.

### **DELEGATIONS TO COUNCIL:**

- 1. MNP Consulting conducted the final presentation on the completed Service Delivery Review. The Report yielded a Current State Report as well as the Final Recommendations. There were 18 recommendations for Council to consider and prioritize. Overall, the consultants felt the Village is well managed with a lean team and a lean budget. There is concern the expenses will eventually exceed revenues, expressing the same concerns of Council in preparing the Report. The 18 recommendations will assist in ensuring long term revenues will meet the needs of the Village. Council will review the Report at the November Council meeting in preparing for the 2021 budget deliberations. The Report will be available on the Municipal website.
- 2. Diana Warriner attended the meeting regarding feral cats. There are concerns that pet owners also allow their cats to run at large expanding the existing cat problems. She requested that the animal control bylaw be amended to include that cats cannot run at large. Currently the Bylaw prohibits dogs and exotic animals but is silent on cats. Council agreed to amend the Bylaw at the next Council meeting.
- 3. Danika Hammond attended the meeting regarding the Santa Claus Parade. She was seeking Council's opinion on holding the Parade during COVID and outlined how it would be possible to continue the event ensure social distancing was maintained. The Santa meet and greet would be cancelled to prevent any large gathering. Council had no concerns with the route or the parade if all rules were followed. Council advised Ms. Hammond to contact the North Bay Parry Sound Regional Health Unit to ensure she was covering all requirements.

### **REPORTS TO COUNCIL:**

- Department Report: Arena Manager Graham Smith presented his report. He commented
  that there has been only one complaint regarding the closure of the ice surface and that
  was from out of the country. He recommends that there be at least 60-70% of normal but
  guaranteed weekly rental hours prior to installing the ice.
- 2. Derek Smith, Public Works Foreman, and the Clerk provided Council with updates on infrastructure projects Yonge Street Rehabilitation and Armstrong Bridge Phase 3.
  - a. Yonge Street: A site meeting was held two weeks ago to correct the retaining wall structure as a "toe" of cement was discovered when the existing wall was removed. The engineering firms are working on resolving. He also reported that the storm sewer must be redesigned. DM Wills has taken a lot of elevation shots to find and resolve the problem, but he believes there was a design issue and the storm already installed will have to be lowered.
  - b. Armstrong Bridge was to be completed with live jacking, but the contractor's engineer indicated that the bridge would not sufficiently be supported so it must be dead jacked. Details are still coming in the proposal including costs and the costs to repair the additional damage discovered to the bridge. However, they will need an amendment to the noise bylaw to allow them to work at night in order to still get the work completed on schedule. Council agreed through resolution to amend the noise bylaw. Council awaits the costing of the additional work prior to the contractor proceeding.



### **ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION:**

- A. Council received the resolutions of the Township of Ryerson and the Township of Armour regarding the closure of the ice surface at the Arena. Armour Council expressed that they would like to have the ice installed. The Arena Manager presented a report on the COVID restrictions, including that rentals from areas outside the Health Unit jurisdiction is prohibited, meaning that teams from Huntsville could not rent the ice. There was a letter received by Armour Council the evening of their meeting expressing that teams were looking to book ice. The Arena Manager explained that he had reached out several times to regular ice rental groups and to date had secured 11 hours per week of rentals. Normal ice rentals would be about 30 hours per week. Council maintained that with the COVID restrictions in place, that there was no interest in many groups to rent the ice and the cost to install and maintain the ice at 30% capacity were reasons to maintain their decision to not install ice until January 2021. The decision will be reviewed monthly and be based on COVID numbers reducing and ice rentals increasing.
- B. Council received the correspondence from the Township of Ryerson regarding the Regional Fire Training Officer and Council agreed to renew the agreement by the end of 2020.
- C. Council received the email from Reeve MacPhail regarding the Regional Fire Department and agreed to continue discussions. They also reviewed the report from the Burk's Falls Ad-hoc Committee indicating that the formula for the Regional Department will also be a concern and the group should proceed with those that want to proceed despite the formula issue and further that there should be a report on what the Regional Fire Department would look like from possibly a third party reviewer.
- D. Council received the letter from the Lions Club seeking to use the Arena Community Hall for their Bingo events. The Arena Manager presented a report on the cost of the request and the alterations that would be required. Council considered that the Service Delivery Review presented early that evening expressed that nominal fees for the use of the Arena for community organizations are not recommended for sustainability and therefore, with the Lions not being able to pay the rental fee, the request was defeated, with regret
- E. Council reviewed correspondence from the Township of Perry regarding the impact of COVID on the Mutual Assistance Agreement for sharing of employees between communities should COVID leave a municipality short on staff. Council agreed to continue with the agreement.
- F. Council received information from the Mayor and Clerk regarding the property near Kelsall and the landfill site. As the property is permitted to be severed from the Landfill site, the partnering communities have no concerns the property could be declared surplus and then subject to the Disposal of Property Bylaw procedures. A resolution was passed.
- G. The Clerk sought clarification from Council on the intent of the residential use of a commercial property. The General Standards Bylaw does not reflect the percentage requirements and there have been inquiries of putting residential units in storefronts. Council reiterated they will not rezone storefronts for residential uses. They passed a resolution to specify at a minimum 50% of the lower/main level of the commercial property must remain commercial use. This will be confirmed in a zoning bylaw in 2021.
- H. Council received the formal written resignation of Lewis Hodgson as Councillor. Council wished Mr. Hodgson well in his future endeavors and thanked him for his 18-year commitment to the Village.
