Section 1. The provisions of these Amended and Restated By-laws ("By-Laws") are applicable to a condominium located at South Fifteenth Street, Bozeman, Montana, known as "Heritage Condominiums"

owners, tenants, employees, or any other person who might use the facilities of "Heritage Condominiums" in any manner, are subject to the regulations set forth in these By-Laws. The acquisition or rental of any of the family units (hereinafter referred to as "units") of the project or the occupancy of any said units will signify that these Bylaws are accepted, ratified, and will be complied with.

(Section 3. All new owners of a unit in Heritage Condominiums shall meet with a Board Member or a Manager employed by the Board of Directors within ten (10) business days of the closing of their purchase on their unit to confirm receipt of a copy of the Administrative Rules adopted by the Board, Bylaws and the Declaration of Condominium Ownership and to discuss any questions the new owner may have. The new owner shall not to east their you until such a meeting has occurred. The new owner is responsible to inform any tenant of

ARTICLE II.

VOTING

Section 1. The owner of each unit in the building shall by virtue of ownership be a member of Heritage Condominiums Association (hereinafter called the "Association"). However, if ownership of any unit is vested in more than one person, while each such owner shall be a member, the several co-owners shall be entitled to vote only

Each unit owner shall be entitled to one (1) vote for each unit owned for votes on non-fiscal matters, hereinafter called "unit vote". For votes on fiscal matters, each unit owner shall be entitled to a vote which shall be based upon the percentile interest which each unit owner has in the common elements according to the Declaration of Condominium Ownerships, hereinafter called the "interest vote". The vote for any unit owned by more than one person shall be exercised as such co-owners may, among themselves, determine, but in no event shall more than one (1) vote be cast with respect to any such unit.}

Section 3. As used in these By-Laws, the term "majority of owners" shall mean the owners holding more than half of the votes assigned as herein provided.

Section 4. Except as otherwise provided in these By-Laws, the presence in person or by proxy of a "majority of owners" shall constitute a quorum. If, however, such quorum shall not be present or represented at any meeting, the members entitled to vote thereat shall have the power to adjourn the meeting from time to time, without notice other than an announcement at the meeting, until a quorum as aforesaid shall be present or be represented.

Section 5. At all meetings of owners, each owner may vote in person or by proxy. All proxies shall be {signed, dated.} and filed with the Secretary {and shall designate an individual to vote for the unit owner. If no individual is designated, the Board of Directors shall have voting authority}. Every proxy shall be revocable and shall automatically cease upon conveyance of the owner's unit.

ARTICLE III.

ASSOCIATION

Section 1. The Association will have the responsibility of administering the operation of Heritage Condominiums, approving the annual budget, establishing and collecting assessments and arranging for the management of the project pursuant to an agreement containing provisions relating to the duties, obligations, removal and compensation of the management agent. - (g) Unfinished Business
- (h) New Business

[Section 6. The principle office of the Association shall be the management agent's office if there is one, or the current Chairperson of the Board of Director's home.}

ARTICLE IV.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND DUTIES

Section 1. The affairs of the Association shall be governed by a Board of Directors, hereinafter call the "Board", composed of (not more than five (5) nor less than three (3) owners. Board Members shall be the owners)

The Board shall have the powers and duties necessary for the administration of the affairs of the Association and may [perform] all acts {including, without limitation, creating policy and reasonable fines and penalties to enforce such policy). Section 3. In addition to duties imposed by these By-Laws or by resolutions of the Association, the Board shall be responsible for scarrying our or coraining? the following:

- (a) Care, upkeep and surveillance of the project and the common areas and facilities.
- Formulation and administration of a detailed annual budget.}

(c) Collection of (annual or special) assessments from owners.

(d) Designation and dismissal of the manager and personnel necessary for the maintenance and operation of the project, common areas and facilities.

(e) Approving vouchers for payment of all legal claims against the Association.

<u>Section 4.</u> The Board may employ for the Association a management agent at a compensation established by the Board to perform such duties and services as the Board shall authorize, including but not limited to, the duties listed in Section 3, above.

Section 5. Election and Terms of Office.

The term of all Directors shall be for two (2) years. The Directors shall hold office until their successors have been elected and hold their first meeting.

<u>Section 6.</u> Any director may be removed by a vote of a majority of votes entitled to be cast at any regular or special meeting of the Association called for that purpose. In the event of such removal, a successor may then and there be elected to fill the vacancy thus created for the unexpired term.

Section 7. Vacancies in the Board caused by any reason other than the removal of a director by a vote of the Association, shall be filled by a vote of the majority of the remaining directors, even though they may constitute less than a quorum, and each person so selected shall serve until the next annual meeting of the Association, at which time the members shall elect a successor to fill out the balance of the unexpired term.

<u>Section 8.</u> The first meeting of a newly elected Board shall be held immediately following the annual meeting of the Association, and no notice shall be necessary to the newly elected directors in order to legally constitute such meeting, provided a majority of the whole Board shall be present.

Section 10. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the Chairman on three (3) days notice to each director. Said notice shall be given either personally, by mail, telephone or shall state the time, place and purpose of the meeting. Special meetings of the Board secretary in a like manner. Notice, as set out above, on the written request of at least three (3) directors, or by county, Montana.

Section 11. Before or at any meeting of the Board, any director may, in writing, waive notice of such meeting and such waiver shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice. Attendance by a director at any meeting of lack of claim by such director.

Section 12. A quorum of the Board for the transaction of business at any meeting shall be a majority of the directors. If, however, a quorum shall not be present the power to adjourn the meeting from time to time without notice other than announcement at the meeting until a quorum as aforesaid shall be present or be represented. At any such adjourned meeting, any business which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally called may be transacted without further notice.

Section 13. The Board may require that officers and employees of the Association handling or responsible for Association funds shall furnish adequate fidelity bonds, {with the} premiums on such bonds to be paid by the

Section 14. The Board shall have the right to buy errors and omissions insurance to protect themselves against malpractice. The premiums for such malpractice insurance shall be borne by the Association.

ARTICLE V

BOARD OFFICERS AND DUTIES

Section 1. The Board, at its annual meeting, shall elect a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and such assistants, as the Board deems necessary. Any two (2) or more offices may be held by the same person, except the offices of Chairman and Secretary. (All officers must be owners, with the exception of the Treasurer.)

Section 2. The officers of the Association shall hold office at the pleasure of the Board, and in the event of a vacancy for any reason, the Board shall elect a successor at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for such a purpose.

Section 3. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Association and the Board. He/She shall have general supervision over the affairs of the Association and it's officers and all of the powers and duties usually vested in the office of President or Chairman of an Association.

Chairman may appoint committees from from time to time as he may decide is appropriate to assist in the conduct of the affairs of the Association, {subject to the approval of the Board}.

Section 4. The Vice-Chairman shall act for the Chairman in the event of the absence of the latter, and shall also perform such other duties as from time to time may be imposed upon him/her by the Board.

Section 5. The Secretary shall keep all books and records of the Association and the Board and record all minutes of meetings of both. Copies of all minutes shall be available to all owners, upon request, by hand delivery, or mail or e-mail.

Section 6. The Treasurer shall have responsibility for Association funds and securities and shall be responsible for <u>[overseeing]</u> full and accurate accounts of all receipts and disbursements in books belonging to the Association. He/She shall be responsible for <u>{overseeing}</u> the deposit of all monies and other valuable effects in the name, and to the credit of the Association in such depositories as may from time to time be designated by the Board.

ARTICLE VI

ASSESSMENTS

Section 1. Assessment against the unit owners shall be recommended and/} or approved by Directors the following provisions: {as set forth below}. The unit owners {shall pay} the Association in accordance with

(a) (Annual assessments up to 10% more than the previous year assessment may be made and approved by the Board. Assessments more than 10% of the previous years assessment requires the approval of the

(b) Each unit owner shall be liable for his share of the common expenses, and any common surplus shall owner is current on their assessments.)

(c) Any assessment, the authority to levy which is granted to the Association or it's Board by the Condominium Declaration, shall be paid by the unit owners to the Association in the proportions set forth in the
provision of the Declaration authorizing the assessment.
(d) Other assessments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws and the Condominium Declaration, to be paid at the time determined by the Board. Assessments for common expenses or emergencies, which cannot be paid from the common expense account (may) be made by the Board.
(e) All sums collected by the Association from assessments may be co-mingled in a single fund, but they shall be held for the unit owners in their respective shares in which they are paid and shall be credited to accounts from which shall be paid the expenses for which the respective assessments are made.
Such accounts shall be as follows:
(i) Common expense accounts - to which shall be credited collections for assessments for all common expenses including liability and hazard insurance premiums as well as payments received for defraying costs of the use of common elements for:

(iii) A capital account for reconstruction, replacement or remodeling

(f) All owners shall be obligated to pay assessments as imposed by the Association to meet all common expenses, including {without limitation}, income taxes, liability and hazard insurance premiums. Assessments for
proper management, maintenance and operation of the common elements. Such annual assessments shall be due shall be in the amount of the estimated common expenses for the year including a reasonable allowance for contingencies and reserves; less the amount of unneeded common expense account balances.
(g) The Secretary and Treasurer shall <u>maintain records reflecting!</u> assessments made against unit owners and such records shall be available for inspection at all reasonable times by unit owners or issue certificates as to the status of a unit owners assessment issued to such persons as the unit owner may request in writing, and such certificates shall limit the liability of any person to whom it is addressed other than the unit owner.
(i) Unit owners and their grantees shall be jointly and severally liable for all unpaid assessments due and may recover from the granter the amounts paid by the grantee thereof. Unpaid portions of assessments which unit (i) Assessments and installments.
(i) Assessments and installments paid more than ten (10) days after the date when due, shall be applied first to interest and then to the earliest assessment due. Interest shall be credited to the common expense account.

ARTICLE VII

BANK ACCOUNTS

(Section 1. Funds of the Association shall be deposited:

(a) Into a trust account, monitored by the State of Montana, and administered by a licensed and bended property manager who may personally disburse funds against properly submitted invoices, or

ARTICLE VIII

MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS

Section 1.

- (a) Every owner must promptly perform all maintenance and repair work within his/her own unit, which if omitted would affect the project in it's entirety or in a part belonging to other owners, being expressly responsible for the damages and liabilities {of said} failure
- (b) All the repairs of internal installation of the unit such as water, light, gas, power, sewerage, telephones, air conditioners, sanitary installations, doors, windóws, lamps and all other accessories and appliances belonging to the unit area shall be at the owners' expense.
- (c) An owner shall reimburse the Association for any expenditures incurred in repairing or replacing any common area and facility damaged through his fault.

Section 2. An owner shall not make any structural modifications or alterations in his unit or installations located therein without previously notifying the Association in writing, through the management agent, if any, or through the Chairman of the Board if no management agent is employed

Section 3. An owner will grant the right of entry to the management agent or any other person authorized by the Board of Directors of the Association in {the} case of any emergency originating in or threatening his/her unit, whether the owner is present at the time or not.

Section 4. An owner shall permit other owners, or their representatives, when so required, to enter his/her unit for the purpose of performing installations, alterations or repairs to the plumbing, mechanical or electrical services, provided request for entry is made {at least 24 hours} in advance and that such entry is at a time convenient to the owner. In the case of an emergency, such right of entry shall be immediate.

ARTICLE IX

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Section 1.

- (a) No resident of the building shall post any advertisements or posters of any kind in or on the project except as authorized by the Board.
- (b) Residents shall not create (a nuisance) by the use of musical instruments, radios, televisions, amplifiers or any other objects or by any action done by the person(s) that disturbs other residents.

- (c) Hanging garments, rugs, etc. from the windows, porches, facades or any other common area is prohibited.
- (d) Dusting rugs, etc. from the windows or cleaning rugs by beating on the exterior part of the project is prohibited.
- (e) Disposal of garbage or trash outside the disposal installations provided for such purposes in the service area is prohibited.

- (j) Owners shall immediately pick-up and remove all excrement dropped by their pets. Dogs shall be kept on a leash or under voice control of an owner when the dog is outside. Dogs shall not be tied to any to peaceful enjoyment of their unit and is therefore prohibited.
- (k) No part of the property shall be used for other than residential purposes. No owner shall permit anything to be done or kept in his/her unit or in the common elements which will result in the cancellation of insurance on the building, or contents thereof, or which would be in violation of any law.
- (o) No rabbits, livestock, fowl, poultry or other animals of any kind shall be raised, bred or kept in any unit, except dogs, cats or other (common) household pets, subject to the rules and regulations adopted by the Board, provided that they are not kept, bred, or maintained for any commercial purposes.
- (p) No nuisances shall be allowed upon the property nor shall any use or practice be allowed which interferes with the peaceful possession and proper use of the property by its residents. No immoral, improper, offensive or unlawful use shall be made of the property nor any part thereof and all valid laws, zoning ordinances and regulations of all governmental bodies having jurisdiction thereof shall be observed.
- (q) Nothing shall be done in any unit or in, on, or to the common elements which will impair the structural integrity of the building or which would structurally change the building except as is otherwise provided herein.
- (r) No industry, business, trade, occupation or profession of any kind, commercial, religious, educational or otherwise shall be conducted, maintained or permitted on any part of the property; nor shall any "For sale" or "for rent" signs or other window displays or advertising be maintained or permitted on any part of the property or in any unit therein; except that grantors and their agents reserve the right to place "for mortgagee or trust indenture beneficiary who may become the owner of any unit, to place such sign on any family unit owned by such mortgagee or beneficiary.
- (s) Nothing shall be planted {except flowers or garden plants adjacent to an owner's unit}. altered or onstructed in or removed from the common elements, except upon the written consent of the Board.

Section 2. Additional Administrative Rules and Regulations {along with reasonable fines and penalties associated with such Rules and Regulations} relating to the details of the administration and operation of Heritage Condominiums and the use of the common elements may be adopted or amended by the Board at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for that purpose.

Section 3. Decisions made by a previous Board may be amended or rescinded by a current Board at any regular meeting or special meeting called for that purpose.}

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ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These By-Laws may be amended by the Association at a duly constituted meeting or by written ballot for such purposes and no amendment shall take effect unless approved by at least three-fourths (3/4) of the owners, and until a copy of the By-Laws, as amended, certified by the presiding officer and Secretary of the Association is recorded in the office of the Clerk and Recorder of Gallatin County, Montana.

ARTICLE XI

MORTGAGEES

Section 1. Any owner who mortgages his/her unit shall notify the Association through the management or the Chairman of the Association in the event there is no manager, the name and address of his agent mortgagee; and the Association shall maintain such information in a book entitled Journal. The Homeowner's {may} give the mortgagee notice in writing of any loss to the common elements which exceeds the sum of \$10,000.00, or damages to any condominium unit which exceeds the sum of \$1,000.00.

Section 2. Any first lien holder or mortgagee shall have the right to have a representative attend any regular or special meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE XII

DUE PROCESS BY HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION

Section 1. In the event that an action is taken by the Homeowners' Association or Board against any individual unit owner to enforce an assessment, or any part of the By-Laws or Declaration, or any rule or regulation properly adopted by the Homeowners' Association, said homeowner shall be afforded the protection of due process which includes, but is not limited to the following:

- (a) Adequate notice in writing of any default with a contingent right to cure the default twithin thirty (30) days.1
 - (b) An opportunity to receive a formal hearing before an impartial form or tribunal.
 - [c] To findings of fact by the formal tribunal in accordance with the evidence presented.
 - [d] A penalty proportionate to the offense such as suspension of voting rights and recreation use rights or a reasonable fine imposed by the Board.
- {(e) If the unit owner believes that a violation is not occurring, the unit owner shall contact the Board in writing within the thirty (30) days and request a hearing. A hearing shall be promptly scheduled before the Board and the unit owner shall have the opportunity to present witnesses and such other evidence the unit owner deems necessary. The Management Agent may also present witnesses and such other evidence, as it deems necessary. The Chairperson of the Board shall have the right to limit the receipt of evidence that is repetitive or not relevant to the mader being heard. The unit owner and the Board shall have the right to cross-examine witnesses who appear at the itearing. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Board shall determine if a violation is occurring or not. It is necessined that a violation is in fact occurring, the Board shall send written notice to the unit owner, by certified mail_return receipt requested, notifying that the unit owner has thirty (30) days to correct the violation.}
- (f) If a unit owner disagrees with the determination of the Board following a hearing, the unit owner shall have the right to file an appeal to an arbitration panel. The Notice of Appeal to Arbitration Panel shall be placed in the mail within fifteen (15) days from the date of receipt of the notice of the Boards hearing decision. The appeal process shall be commenced by the unit owner delivering a written Notice of Appeal to Arbitration Panel, to the Board by registered mail, return receipt requested,

The arbitration panel shall consist of three members and shall be selected as follows:

- (i) Each party shall select a member to serve on the arbitration panel and shall notify the other party in writing of the person so selected. This notification shall occur no later than fifteen (15) days following the receipt of

Hi Doug and everyone,

I have reviewed the Bylaws and here are my comments, suggestions, questions:

Article I, Section 3 – good addition

Article II, Section 2 – the period and quotation marks should be reversed in the new, bracketed and underlined sentence (just a minor correction). Also, I'm a bit confused about the two types of votes, "unit" or "interest." To me this says that the "interest" vote is based on the percentage of interest we have, but I don't understand how a partial percentage works....does that make sense? For example how would my vote as the owner of smaller unit compare to the vote of someone with a larger unit, if it's not 1:1? How can anyone have less than 1 vote? Maybe I'm just not understanding it correctly.

Article V, Section 3 – there is an extra "from" in the proposed sentence. Also, I think it should

read, "The Chairman may appoint committees from time to time as he/sae may....."

Article VI, Section 1, f – I think we should add some language that says that units need to be given 6 months (at least) notice of a special assessment (maybe this is unreasonable, but the more time the better). Also, the way the language reads right now, the upcoming assessment for the siding is due January 1, but we are telling people that it's due May 1. Does this need to be corrected?

Article VIII, Section 2 - good change

Article IX, Section 1, b – (just a comment) I submit that Karl's video camera is a "nuisance." Article IX, Section 1, g – "...canopies or other objects on the outside walls of a building, to lace decks, dack railings, or the roof without..."

Article IX, Section 1, i - good change/addition

Article IX, Section 1, I – good addition – should we add a specified amount of time by which the documents should be received, i.e., within 10 days?

Article IX, Section 1, m – remove the second "family" from the last sentence (to be consistent with the rest of the document). Also, is the "one (1) additional parking space," referring to the parking space that comes with the unit?

Article IX, Section 1, r - remove the word "family" from the last sentence.

Article IX, Section 1, s – Does this mean that unit owners can plant flowers, etc. without prior permission from the Board?

Article IX, Section 2 - good addition

Article XII, Section 1, e – Last sentence is missing "II" at the beginning of the sentence – needs it to make sense.

Article XII, Section 1, i – I recommend adding "each party shall select a Board or member to serve on the arbitration..." (if that what this means)

I also ask that we consider adding some language that allows the Heritage Condominium Association to install surveillance cameras, if necessary, and at its discretion, but that no single owner is allowed to have a camera which surveils the common areas. Doug and I talked about this and he was better at coming up with the language; obviously everyone has to agree so please let Doug know what you think.

Finally, I've always thought we should let the entire association know about our monthly meetings in case someone wants to come, so I wonder if we can add the meeting time, place to the mailing that Rich is sending out in December....what do you think...most people

Article IX, Section 1(s) – I think this should read like this for clarity:

{Owners or tenants, with permission from owners, may plant flowers or garden plants adjacent to an owner's unit}. Nothing{else} shall be planted, altered or constructed in or removed from the common elements, except upon the written consent of the Board.

Article IX, Section 3 – I think this addition undermines every decision that the Board has made and will make in the future. Decisions could be made and sought to be changed meeting after meeting ad infinitum. Owners who get permission from the Board may find that at another meeting that permission is rescinded resulting in possible monetary loss which could result in lawsuits. I think this section should be considered carefully.

Article XII, Section 1(i) – Regarding Board member Stephanie Davison's recommendation that "a Board or Association member " serve on the arbitration panel, I don't think that is necessary. I'm not familiar with arbitration proceedings but I think a party shouldn't be limited to all rules of arbitration.

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Hello Fellow Board Members,

Here are my ideas for the bylaw changes.

Article VI, Section 1(b) – I think we need to clarify whether the common surplus shall be divided by "unit" share or "interest" share as explained for voting in Article II, Section 2. I am assuming it would be an interest share since the surplus is a fiscal matter.

Article VI, Section 1(c) – Remove the apostrophe from "it's" in "... Association or it's Board..." It's = it is.

Article VI, Section 1(h) – I assume our lawyers think "pursuant to Montana Law" is sufficient and no specific law needs to be listed.

Article VIII, Section 2 – I think we need to clarify the sentence "An owner shall not make any structural modifications or alterations in his unit...". I think structural modifications AND alterations is redundant unless we want the Board to authorize every alteration to a unit.

Article IX, Section 1(a)(d)(h) - Can we change the word "project" to something with less negative connotations? I would prefer the word complex or Heritage Condominiums or

Article IX, Section 1(f) - Can we come with a provision for recycling bins? I know some residents would like to store their recycling materials outside. Do people object to the sight or the smell or just the idea of something like that on other peoples decks? Maybe they should seek Board approval for an acceptable receptacle.

Article IX, Section 1(k) - I think foster children should be added to the end of the definition of

Article IX, Section 1(m) - Remove "family" from "...owner of that family unit requires ...". Also, loes this section mean that if a resident has a boat, motorcycle, or trailer that they need to park them in the garage and their car outside? It doesn't seem very clear to me.
