
Prepare: How to Determine What & How Much

Measure the perimeter of your yard, but first:

- Confirm your property line. In order to get accurate measurements, you need to know exactly where your property line is.
- Locate underground utilities. Underground utility lines will affect where your fence posts can be placed.
- Research local zoning codes and restrictions. Some cities and neighborhoods have restrictions on fencing.
- Check for obstructions.
- Mark and measure your yard. (utilize the grid found on page 10 of this guide)

Note: Where there are sections of yard less than 8 feet in length, panels will need to be cut down.

Now that you have selected your type of fence, you are ready to create a shopping list of materials and draft your task list.




- Place a stake in each corner of your yard and every 8 feet, as that is where posts will go.
- Add up all your measurements and divide by 8, as most panels are sold in 8 foot sections, or utilize an online fencing caluculator to determine the quantity of panels you will need.

Note: Home Series aluminum fence comes in 6 foot sections

• Think about where you would place your gates if you are going to have any.

- Count the number of corners of your yard and that is the number of corner posts you need - write that number down.
- Count the number of stakes you put in the ground every 8 feet and that is the number of line posts you will need - write that number down.
- If you fence stops are your house, a tree or a gate that is an end post - count how many you will need - write that number down.

Note: modify your calculations if your fence panels will not be 8ft. sections



COLOR **KEY**

Corner Post: Used to connect two sections of fence coming together at 90°.

Line Post: Posts with holes on two opposite sides to connect

End Post: Used to end a line of fence. Only one section of fence will connect to an end post.

Install: What Do I Need and How To Do It?

Now that you have your fence, take a minute to make sure you have all the parts and all the tools you will need for installation.

Material Checklist:

- □ Flat Head Screwdriver
- ☐ Circular Saw or Hand Saw
- Bag of High Strength Concrete $(1^{1}/_{2} \text{ bags per hole average})$
- ☐ Coarse Gravel (6" per hole)
- □ Water for Concrete
- □ Clean Rags
- ☐ Post Hole Digger
- ☐ Safety Glasses
- ☐ String Line Stakes
- ☐ Spool of String
- ☐ Vinyl Cement
- □ Line Level
- ☐ Tape Measure
- □ Shovel
- □ Rubber Mallet

Be sure to take a complete inventory or all parts using the kit contents. Do not attempt to assemble the fence if parts are missing or damaged.

General Installation Overview:

PLAN:

Plot where your new fence will go. Mark the fence location using string and stakes.

PREPARE:

Dig post holes and install posts using approriate measurements and depths. (This can be found in your specific product install instructions that is included with your purchased product.)

INSTALL:

Assemble panels by connecting boards/pickets to rails and installing into posts.

ACCESORIZE:

Attach post tops to posts. Various styles and colors as well as solar post top lights are available.
