

Kishwaukee Water Reclamation District Board Meeting Minutes Wednesday, October 16, 2019 – 12:00 PM

The October meeting of the Kishwaukee Water Reclamation District Board of Trustees was held at the office of the District at 12:00 pm on Wednesday, October 16, 2019. 1. Call to Order

President Collins called the meeting to order at 12:40 p.m.

2. Approval of the October Agenda

President Collins moved approval of the October agenda. Trustee Zar seconded. The motion carried by a 3-0-0 roll call vote. Aye: Collins, Struthers, Zar. Nay: None. President Collins declared the motion passed.

3. Approval of September Meeting Minutes

President Collins moved approval of the September Meeting Minutes. Trustee Struthers seconded. The motion carried by a 3-0-0 roll call vote. Aye: Collins, Struthers, Zar. Nay: None. President Collins declared the motion passed.

4. Approval to pay bills as presented

5. Public Input and Communications

Mark Eddington introduced Bill Nicklas, City Manager of City of DeKalb.

6. Treasurer's Report

Steve Parker gave the Treasurer's Report and discussed investments.

7. District Dashboards

Mark Eddington discussed the District's "Dashboard" and stated that the revenue numbers were solid despite decreased units sold, and expenses conutinue to be under budget. Regarding environmental compliance, Mark commented once the new facility is brought online the ammonia issues should go away. Due to recent wet weather events, the number of Call-Ins as well as overtime hours were higher than normal.

8. Capital Needs (FY 20/21)

a) Centrifuge

Mark Eddington commented on the need to include in the upcoming FY 20/21 budget funds for a third centrifuge, centrifuge feed pump, and associated mechanical and electrical work at a cost of approximately \$600,000.

b) Sewer Truck

Steve Olsen stated the sewer televising truck requires extensive repairs and updates to the televising equipment. He feels the District should consider purchasing a new sewer inspection vehicle rather than attempt to retrofit our existing 2002 panel truck.. The cost of a new sewer truck would be approximately \$300,000 and should be considered in our 2020/21 capital budget

10. Recap of New NPDES Permit

a) Future Phosphorus limit

Mark Eddington reviewed the requirements for the future phosphorus limit of 1.0 mg/l by 2023.

b) Future Nitrogen Limit

Mark Eddington reviewed the requirements for the future nitrogen limit which in all likelihood would be 2035.

c) CMOM (Collection, Management, Operation, and Maintenance) Plan

Mark Eddington reviewed the requirements of maintaining a database to catalog data to help manage the collection system. The District is required to file its CMOM by September 2021.

d) Nutrient Reduction Planning

Mark Eddington reviewed the requirement for submitting Nutrient Reduction plans to the IEPA.

e) NARP

Mark Eddington reviewed the requirements for participating in a Nutrient Assessment Reduction Plan (NARP).

a) Krusinski Memorandum of Understanding

Mark Eddington reviewed the details of the proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Krusinski Construction addressing the annexation fees for the Chicago West development project. The Board authorized Mark Eddington to sign the MOU and further gave him latitude to make any minor changes necessary to finalize the agreement with Krusinski Construction.

a) Fairview Drive Sewer Extension

Mark Eddington stated Staff and Foster & Buick have drafted an agreement for engineering costs and terms of service costs with Waste Management, which have been sent to Waste Management for review and comment.

b) Malta and Kishwaukee College Sewer Extension

Mark Eddington stated B&W is nearing completion of design documents. The project has received planning approval from the IEPA loan program and Staff has begun working on the IEPA Loan Application. Ordinance No. 585 authorizing the District to borrow funds from the Water Pollution Control Loan Program in the amount of \$7.25 million has been prepared by Foster & Buick and is recommended for approval.
