All-Net Tryout Process - **Girls**

Players are allowed to play in ONLY one (1) NJB League: either Division or All-Net.

1. Open Boundaries – “no” Waivers required for Girls All-Net Teams
2. If Players tryout for an All-Net team in a non-Local Chapter and do not make the team, they cannot play Division League in the non-Local Chapter, the Player MUST play Division ball in their Local Chapter
3. 7 Players Minimum and 12 Players Maximum per Team
4. Team composition:
 - 5 Local Players minimum per Team
 - 7 Non-Local Players maximum per Team
5. Local Players MUST be checked “√ **Local**” on the All-Net Team Roster – 5 minimum Local Players. Players will be verified during the All-Net Certification process
6. Inform on the All-Net Team Roster if your team will be “Local” or “Coop”
7. If a Chapter do not field a Grade Level Team, Players can tryout in another Chapter
8. Chapters can Coop a Team with a Buddy Chapter to help maximize number of Teams in the League:
 - Chapters Buddying up should make all efforts to not over-load the Local Chapter with Non-Local Players contrary to the allowed # of Players
 - However, if a good faith effort has been applied putting a Team together and an over-load opportunity allows the formation of another Team, an Exception can be granted by the Section Director – a case will need to be made for the over-load
 - Example of 2 chapters Buddying up to coop teams:
 - Chapter 1 field the 5th Grade coop team because they have more 5th graders
 - Chapter 2 field the 6th Grade coop team because they have more 6th graders
 - Chapter 3 field the 7th Grade coop team because they have more 7th graders
 - Chapter 4 field the 8th Grade coop team because they have more 8th graders
 - etc
 - The Section have paired up Buddy Chapters to keep some balance in the program
9. Players can play on ONLY one (1) Team
10. Teams are allowed to play up a Grade Level during the Regular Season and then play in the Sectional Tournament in the same Grade Level played during the Regular Season thereby playing to qualify for the National Tournament in the same Grade Level
11. Teams are allowed to play up a Grade Level during the Regular Season and can then play down to their regular Grade Level with an At-Large Bid straight to the National Tournament
12. If a Chapter fields two (2) Teams in a Grade Level, those teams may play/compete against each other depending on the number of Teams in the Grade Level
13. If we get enough Teams in a Grade Level, we will look to create two (2) levels
