Haiti Dairy Moving into Production Phase

"ARE YOU MILKING COWS YET?"

This question has been asked hundreds of times as HarvestCall's Haiti Dairy Program's Good Vision Farm (GVF) moved from a concept to a bare land purchase and then through an intense 5-building construction phase. And the first cows were milked by hand as the construction of the milking

center moved into full swing. Then this happened—the milking center construction was completed, and in March the first cows were milked in the milking center at Good Vision Farm. And not only are the cows being milked, but the milk is being pasteurized and put into reusable glass bottles and sold. So yes! We are milking cows at Good Vision Farm!

But what exactly is Good Vision Farm? It is a demonstration and research farm in southern Haiti about 40 minutes

miracles and joy. Currently, Bro. Les and Sis. Christine Kaeb and Bro. Daryl and Sis. Debbie Knobloch live in the lower and upper floors of the new missionary house, which is located right on the farm. Les has overseen construction and planning, built relationships with the community, and since Daryl's move to Haiti in September, he has worked diligently to discover what crops and forages work best in these heavy Haitian soils. But all of this has simply been a vehicle to share the gospel of Jesus Christ and be an example of Christian living to the many people around them.

And they are indeed watching them. The Haitians are observing and learning how the truth of God's Word is lived out in everyday activities and decisions. As the program

For over 15 years self-help loans were used to aid in starting and building small businesses in Eastern Europe. The brethren there are very thankful to HarvestCall for their aid over the many years as this helped feed many growing families. As HarvestCall continues to learn from the brethren there, it seems that many young ones in this next


generation aren't as interested in starting a small business to support their families. Today the younger generation would prefer to be employed rather than start a small family business (e.g. small greenhouse). This may not be true in all cases but seems to be the trend as the culture is shifting. The European Union also sees the need and spends a lot of funding trying to incentivize young people to work in agriculture by offering grants and government funding. In cases like Romania, where the borders are open to the Western European countries, it is an enticing opportunity to go work in Western Europe. In some of these countries the

> average salary can be up to 5 times that in Romania but the cost of living is only about double. This often draws many young people away from their families to Spain, Italy or

appeared good to many young ones over the years (believers and non-believers), it has left many of the churches with very few or no young families. Yet, there are some that had

With an early funding commitment of \$150,000 from HarvestCall, construction began in January 2018.

Original estimates placed the cost at ~\$325,000, but unanticipated remodeling complications raised the actual expense to ~\$375,000.

As the word spread among our brotherhood about this

need, and with generous support from our ~2,000 current sponsors, the gap was completely covered through donations of materials and money. God knew the need and moved hearts — it is not a coincidence that the donations covered the difference, almost to the dollar! The Lord does provide!

Under the direction of a professional Construction Team consisting of brothers representing

various trades, and the able
coordination and workmanship of
the Haitian Construction Manager
and his team of dedicated
laborers, the new facility
was completed near the
end of 2018, with move-in
occurring in January 2019.
An informal Open House
was conducted at that time,
with a more formal Dedication
Service to be scheduled later to ask
God's blessing on the
facility and its use.

Primary features of the new office facility include:

- More functional offices for our missionaries and Haitian support staff, including combining our two Christian education partners in Haiti in one facility
- A large meeting area and kitchen that

will support day-long spiritual training, as well as daytime Bible Studies, and evening worship services

- Dedicated storage space for newly developed Christian curriculum materials to serve over 12,000 students
- Adequate reception space to accommodate the many students, parents, and pastors who come to the office
- New capabilities and resources to share the gospel with the students and parents while they wait to be served

Privacy for individual counseling

According to Bro. Mike and Sis. Susie Walder, HarvestCall Haiti Child Sponsorship Administrators, "There is no doubt that the primary focus of Child Sponsorship is to teach salvation and share God's Word with the students and faculties of the schools we serve. However, we are convinced that this expanded office facility will greatly enhance our ministry by

providing greater opportunities to interact more directly with the students and faculty. It is also such a blessing to bring our two child sponsorship partners together in one facility, which will significantly improve communication and coordination and make our overall program more effective to advance God's Kingdom."



Share Your Story. Share the Gospel.

When was the last time you shared your story of what Jesus has done in your life perhaps with a neighbor. your friend or a stranger in the grocery store?

Sharing the gospel doesn't have to be difficult. Just start by sharing your story of the love of Jesus and what he has done for you. Many in the world are hurting today and need to hear about the hope that Jesus brought to you and can bring to them.

During the HarvestCall Texas Rebuilding Ministry from January through March, work teams learned

more about sharing the gospel through studying the final three Lessons 7, 8 and 9 in the "Sharing the Gospel" series. Each week, Bro. Ron Farney led them through the lessons with enthusiasm and clarity. A video was played to introduce the lesson and participants then read scripture, completed exercises to learn key concepts, and sang a song. This same pattern was followed during the past two winter work projects when Lessons 1-3 were rolled out in 2017 and Lessons 4-6, in 2018.

Let's spend a few minutes looking at each of these new lessons more closely. In Lesson 7, called, "Compelling Community," participants studied how God designed his church to be able to draw or "compel" the unbeliever to come and be part of a new, healthy community. Within this new community, the church, God has designed and equipped His people with spiritual gifts needed to support the mission of seeking, saving and supporting the lost souls. Everyone has a role to play. With these thoughts in mind, participants were challenged to reflect on their own spiritual gifts and how they support their local church in fulfilling its mission.

Through Lesson 8, students learned about "A Culture of Evangelism" -what is it and what did it look like in the early church in Acts 4. Basically, a culture of evangelism is described as "a place where sharing the gospel is practiced, prayed for, actively engaged and funded (as needed)." Participants were then asked to identify the attributes that are evident in a church that is committed to sharing the gospel. Included are prayer,


fasting, preaching the Word, testimonies, baptisms, communion, developing disciples and being able to send brethren to other locations to bolster/ plant churches... just to name a few. Do these sound familiar? Many are practiced in our churches today.

Lesson 9 focused on the "Blessings of Faithful



transitions into the production phase, we will also be developing Haitian leaders to live the gospel as a daily practice in all the production activities at the farm. An example of this is a young man who lives very close to the farm and keeps some cows across the road. This young man is still finishing his schooling. But he is so interested in learning better ways to feed his cattle in hopes that they will be able to participate in the dairy program too. In fact, he shows up at milking time nearly every day. It is the interest of the native Haitian people, like this young man, that gives the program such a boost of encouragement.

There is some excitement in the air surrounding the farm during this time as the farm starts ramping up milk production and marketing. Les was pretty sure that missionary families had an interest in the milk provided at Good Vision Farm. But would the locals be interested in it too? Recently, a young mother of two boys came to watch at milking time and as Les showed her a bottle of milk, her eyes lit up as she

held it in her hands with delight. She returned the empty bottle the very next day and said they enjoyed every bit of

it! This young mother is one of many people from the community that are now expressing interest in buying the fresh milk, pasteurized on the farm, and kept in refrigeration at the farm.

Some of the challenges moving forward include refrigeration and storage, marketing, timing, quality control, procedures for admitting local farmers' cows into the dairy program, and more. Your prayers are sincerely needed as this program moves from Phase 1 Construction to Phase 2 Production. It is a lot of change, but it is time to move forward and see what the Lord will do with Good Vision Farm. It is our prayer that the name of Jesus is proclaimed and that his presence and guidance is felt as this ministry continues to develop.
