Eye Clinics Help Hundreds See More Clearly

PROVIDING EDUCATION AND CORRECTIVE GLASSES

The only glasses available that matched Cherestal Maqdola's exact prescription were an old, extremely large pair. One felt bad even showing the glasses to her, thinking her face would show obvious disappointment when she saw them.

However, Cherestal hardly even looked at the glasses as she put them on and reached for a nearby Bible. "Praise God, I can read the Bible again, I see so good!" she exclaimed. Cherestal went on to explain that she had not been able to read

the Bible for quite a few years because she could not see the words clearly enough. She continued "I can get up and lead song service in the church again." She was all smiles and sang a song as she cheerfully left the clinic.

Helping patients like Cherestal see clearly again is part of what the AC HarvestCall eye

Acts 20:35 clinics hope to accomplish. The eye clinics are very busy, typically seeing 80-100 patients each day. If vision needs are identified, team members attempt to match the patient's prescription with one of

approximately 1,000 pair of used eyeglasses on hand – including reading glasses. In addition to providing corrective lenses, the teams check patients for glaucoma, diabetes, retinal issues, and cataracts.

Education and care is given for dry eyes, poor lighting conditions and other eye issues that are common in Haiti.

2010 was the 2nd year that HarvestCall eye clinics were conducted at Hospital Lumiere.

More are planned for the future, hopefully on an annual basis. In the future, the eye teams would like to purchase surgical instruments and equipment to expand services offered, like cataract surgery. Another long term goal is to improve screening and treatment of glaucoma, a blinding disease which the team found to be quite prevalent in Haiti.

GOT GLASSES? YOU CAN HELP!

Used eye glasses are needed to distribute to patients like Cherestal. Both adult and children's glasses are needed. Glasses must

be in very good condition and complete, with both frame and lenses intact. Lined bifocals and trifocals are especially useful rather than progressive (noline) bifocals, but any in good condition can be used.

When Jocelyn arrived at Hospital Lumiere in February of 2015, he was not expected to live. Jocelyn suffered from



Not long ago, Jean Chavannes Cassamajor could only walk about 20 feet without becoming seriously winded. The inability to "catch his breath" was because of a faulty mitral valve in his heart, damaged by a bout of rheumatic fever when Jean was young. Through a collaboration between Hospital Lumiere and a hospital in St. Cloud, Minnesota, Jean was able to travel to St. Cloud for a balloon procedure which repaired the valve. Without the surgery, Jean could not have survived much longer.

Jean's follow-up care includes periodic exams by hospital staff and visiting medical teams. Jean is thankful his recent checkup indicates he should be able to lead a normal life and be able to work. He is grateful and happy he will now have a better future. Jean felt a lot of Christian love at the hospital and during his 5 days in St. Cloud. To those who made it all possible he says "Thank you and may God bless you".

Opportunities to Serve at Hospital Lumiere

TEACHER OPPORTUNITY

This position involves full-time teaching in the multi-level classroom setting of the Missionary School on the Hospital Lumiere compound. This is a full time missionary position with a service term of 6 months, with the opportunity to extend the term of service. A minimum of a Bachelor's Degree is preferred, especially in the field of Education or Child Development.

MEDICAL DIRECTOR

Seeking a licensed physician to serve full-time as Medical Director. Qualifications include a U.S. medical license, be Board-Certified in some aspect of medicine or surgery, have experience in leadership and management and be willing to reside with your family on the Hospital Lumiere campus for three to five years.

PATIENT CARE MANAGER

Seeking a qualified person to serve full-time as Patient Care Manager of the hospital. The duties of Patient Care Manager include planning, supervising & training employees and coordinating & implementing programs of nursing care for all hospital patients. Applicants should hold an RN degree and have at least 3 years of nursing experience, some management capability, and be willing to relocate to Haiti for a term of 3 to 5 years.

Seeking an energetic, self-motivated, responsible Believer to fill the position of Medical Department Intern for a term of 6 months. Responsibilities include helping the Medical Director with staff scheduling, communications between departments (Nursing, Pharmacy, Radiology, Lab), monitoring inventories and medical supplies and various other responsibilities. Lodging, food and living expenses are provided. A medical background is not required, but is helpful.

OTHER OPPORTUNITIES


