# DONY IS ONE OF MANY ROADSIDE CASUALTIES IN HAITI

Traveling can be hazardous in Haiti. Many roads are poor and often crowded with autos, motorcycles, animals and people. For many Haitians, walking is a primary mode of transportation. Along Haiti's roads, pedestrians are highly vulnerable

and accidents can occur at any moment. Unfortunately for Dony Gay, a 33-year-old farmer, that moment arrived. A car passed too closely and struck his right leg as he was walking near his home. Dony was fortunate that no bones were broken, but he suffered

major skin and tissue damage.

Dony sought help at a hospital

this care, recovery would likely have been difficult or impossible and could have resulted in permanent loss of function or death.

The loving care Dony received at Hospital Lumiere makes him grateful. Dony says "The nurses have treated me well and others have helped me and given me food." At Hospital Lumiere, families provide the patient with food and help with their bathing and general care. Since Dony was so far from home, neither his wife nor daughter could accompany him to provide for his daily needs.


Dony was raised in a Christian home but had never been converted. His accident became a wake-up call and he has since surrendered his life to Christ. Dony now recognizes that only God offers an enduring source of health and strength and is happy when the pastor comes to pray with him. He has a peace that God will continue to help him heal and will see him though. When Dony leaves Hospital Lumiere, his local pastor will be informed and will continue with prayers and spiritual nurturing.

# As It Hath Pleased Him – Reflections on Serving in Haiti

IN 2016, BRO. DR. LEE AND SIS. DESMA KLOPFENSTEIN COMPLETED 3 YEARS OF SERVICE AT HOSPITAL LUMIERE AND RETURNED TO THE U.S.

There it was for us to see, and we didn't even grasp the significance... as it hath pleased Him. We knew, as converted people, God wanted us to serve within the body, but didn't realize that our service might be manifested differently throughout the seasons of life; and furthermore, that this service was not really under our control. Obedience is our choice, but placement is up to the Lord. As we have expressed before, the time spent in Haiti opened our eyes and hearts to three critical concepts: to listen, to lighten, and to loosen.



Missionary Service – Wherever, Whenever, Whatever!

We needed first to listen to Him, but also, we needed to listen to our fellow missionaries and others as we worked together sharing all things tangible and intangible in a foreign culture.

Lord, help us to continue to listen earnestly in our own culture where we live so independently.

Next, we learned that our duty is to lighten the burden

of suffering as Christ would to those around us. The constant "knocks" on the door were opportunities, not intrusions. Servanthood should not center around our convenience.

Lord, help us to be open to the "knocks" on the door of our heart in dealing with others and their suffering. Help us to truly see each soul as our neighbor.

Lastly, we needed to embrace the truth that nothing in this life belongs to us, not our homes, our jobs, our children, or our

spouse. In realizing this, we could begin to loosen our grip on the things we called, "mine".

Lord, help us as we return to a culture of "stuff" that nothing belongs to us, and that Thou may require it in Thy time.


When God called us to serve as it pleased Him in Haiti, the "heart signs" were sure. Being a foreign missionary is a very public manifestation of service. However, weren't we missionaries before Haiti? Weren't we just like our


brothers and sisters who labored beside us in the local
