CARRIED FOR 10 MILES TO BRING HER TO HOSPITAL LUMIERE

Bidone Minouche was critically ill with tuberculosis and desperately needed help. Her mother had previously sought treatment for 11 year-old Bidone from multiple local

doctors, none of which could offer her help. Now Bidone was suffering from severe abdominal swelling, which can happen when a patient has TB and decreased immunity levels. Thankfully,

ABOUT HOSPITAL LUMIERE

- June 1, 2016 marks the 5 year anniversary of HarvestCall (formerly ACWR) assuming management of daily operations at Hospital Lumiere.
- A financial assistance fund helps those who cannot afford to pay for care. Approx. 17% of patients benefit.
- Over 13,000 patients received medical care at Hospital Lumiere in 2015.
 - Over 5,000 Bible tracts were distributed at Hospital Lumiere in 2015.
 - The Chaplain's Office also distributes food and other nonmedical items to patients.
 - In 2015, 91 Hospital Lumiere patients surrendered their lives to Jesus Christ.

Unfortunate Mix-Up Leads to Explosion

BURN VICTIM FINDS RELIEF AND COMPASSION

When Ferjuste Dernier filled the lamp, he thought it was with kerosene. Through an unfortunate mix-up, it wasn't. He had been given gasoline instead, and when he lit the lamp, it exploded, resulting in third degree burns to his right arm and abdomen. When Ferjuste arrived at Hospital Lumiere

he was in pain, dehydrated and feverish. The staff feared he would not survive. That was two months ago, and today Ferjuste is healing. Pain medication is giving him relief and antibiotics

are guarding against infection. Thankfully, he is on a steady road to recovery.

Many of the Hospital Lumiere staff members have assisted in caring for Ferjuste. Since he

was unable to help and feed himself, many employees pitched in to provide for

him. "All the people love me and God loves me," exclaimed Ferjuste. In spite of his condition, he is thankful for the good care he has received, and thankful so many strangers have been willing to help him.

There are still some bumps ahead on the road to recovery. Ferjuste may be at the hospital for several more months until he heals adequately and until he can take care of himself. With good care and by God's grace, we look forward to the day he can again return to his home.



Medical Supplies needed

GUIDELINES FOR EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES

- All sterile supplies and medications must have at least six (6) months dating before expiration. Any materials that do not meet this criteria will not be accepted.
- Items need to be sorted and boxed with like-items in a box. The box should be clearly labeled.
- Collected items will be shipped from the Bluffton, Indiana Distribution Center. There are regular shipments of materials from the Goodfield, Illinois Distribution Center to Bluffton.
- If you have a large donation of supplies or have questions about items you would like to donate, contact Bob Honegger rahonegger@gmail.com
- If you don't have supplies, but want to help, please consider donating to enable the hospital to purchase them. Write "Medical Supplies" on your check memo.



ITEMS WE NEED

The following is a list of items that are used in large quantities:

- 1. Exam gloves size large & medium
- 2. Surgical gloves size 7.5
- 3. Syringes luer lock 5cc & 10cc
- 4. Needles 1.5" x 18g, 20g, 21g, 22g, 25g
- 5. Disposable diapers size newborn & 1
- 6. Suture 1, 0, 00, 000, 0000 chromic gut and/or polyglactin with cutting or taper needle
- 7. Suture 1, 0, 00, 000, 0000 nylon with cutting or taper needle
- 8. Angio-cath 18g, 20g, 22g, 24g
- 9. Antiseptic wipes
- 10. Crutches sizes 5'2" & 5'10"
- 11. Batteries AA & AAA
- 12. Foley catheters size 12, 14, 16, 18 & 20fr; 3-way Foley catheters - size 22 or 24 fr
- 13. Surgical gowns size large
- 14. Surgical drapes
- 15. Isolation gowns
- 16. Urine collection bags
- 17. Alcohol prep pads
- 18. NG tubes size 5fr 10fr
- 19. Ace bandages size 2" & 3"
- 20. Adult primary IV sets (10 drops/min.)
- 21. Pediatric primary IV sets (60 drops/min.)
