CAREGIVING

Caregivers are generally family members who find themselves thrust into the role of providing unpaid assistance in meeting the physical, psychological and/or social needs of a loved one. An estimated 21 million Americans provide care to a relative, friend or neighbor who is 50 or older. Currently, 66% of caregivers are female and 44% are male. The number of grandparents raising grandchildren in the U.S. is rapidly growing.

Respite

Respite services are available to support individuals who are caring for adults 60 + years of age, and grandparents who are 55+ caring for grandchildren under the age of 18. Respite can range from a few hours per week or more, depending on the needs and resources of the family and can take place in the family's home, the home of a friend or relative, a daycare center or even a church. Respite can be used for many things such as visiting a family or friends, running errands, spending an evening at the movies or taking a vacation.

Support Services

A caregiver support group can offer an atmosphere of understanding and support for caregivers to discuss issues and problems. Additional support and resources are provided with guest speakers, information about community resources, and help dealing with the stress and losses associated with caregiving.

Information and Assistance

Caregiver Presentations are available for medical personnel, caregiver groups, senior citizens centers and business employees. Also available are booths for health fairs and senior days.

Access to Services

Assistance in accessing the various services available in the community is also provided, such as, Legal Aide, homebound meals, Medicare Part D help and enrollment, Advantage Case Management and transportation.
