FIELD APPRAISAL



A field appraisal report includes an on-site inspection by one of our associates and is typically utilized for estimating the value of machinery and equipment. On-site inspection details and photographs are included in the appraisal report. This report expresses value as a single figure for each tangible asset valued and the aggregate is reported as a single number.

DESKTOP SUMMARY APPRAISAL

A desktop appraisal report is typically used to determine value without the expense of an on-site inspection of the machinery or equipment. Pictures, a brief description of the machinery or equipment, usage/income history, and/or maintenance history are among the types of information supplied to ART by the client. ART then establishes a value based on this information and issues the Certified Appraisal.
