<u>A branch</u> ~ a week before his crucifixion, Jesus entered Jerusalem ~ the crowds pulled branches from trees and shouted "Hosanna!"

<u>A small cup</u> ~ "Then he (*Jesus*) took a cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them (*his disciples*) and said 'Drink this and remember me'"

 $\underline{\textbf{Coins}}$ ~ Judas, one of Jesus' followers, betrayed Jesus and was paid for his betrayal

<u>Something prickly or with stickers</u> ~ Pontius Pilate placed a crown of thorns on the head of Jesus before he was crucified

<u>An interesting piece of wood</u> ~ Jesus was hung on a cross made of wood

<u>Something that is no longer alive</u> — While he was on the cross, Jesus asked God to forgive all of those that had hurt him and then said "It is Finished" and he died

<u>Something white such as fabric or paper...</u> Jesus was wrapped in white linen before being placed in the tomb

<u>A Stone</u> –Jesus was placed in the tomb and a large stone was rolled against the opening

<u>Something beautiful and alive</u> — Jesus did not stay in the tomb! The angel said "You are looking for Jesus, but he is not here! He has risen!"

After you arrange all of your items, tell the story of Easter to your family!

One of the last things that Jesus told his disciples was *Go into all the world and tell everyone about me!* While we are "sheltering in place" we can't go too far out into the world, but we can still share the good news about Jesus! Find some sidewalk chalk and write messages of hope for your neighbors to see! If you don't have a sidewalk, or if you don't have sidewalk chalk, make a poster to hang in your window!

Rejoice in the Lord always, I will say it again; REJOICE! Philippians 4:4


I trust in your unfailing love... Psalms 13:5
